Pastoral Perspective

CELEBRATING ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA (But not too much)

At a recent gathering of Jesuits in Chicago, one of our younger guys is said to have remarked that St. Ignatius would roll over in his grave if he knew that *his name* is more often invoked by Jesuits than the name of Our Lord! I am sure that the comment was made both in humor and in all seriousness. Looking over a sample of my homilies, however, although I've often invoked Ignatius, I plead not guilty overall!

Still, I recognize the truth behind the joke. And it is all the more ironic, of course, because one of the hallmarks of Ignatius's spiritual teachings was that we are all to strive for *interior freedom* in living our spiritual lives. That is to say that we ought to be free of all attachments in placing ourselves at the service of God. And those attachments are anything that we erroneously come to believe are essential or of enormous importance to us in finding our happiness and peace in God. These include all our obvious obsessions and addictions, of course, but the attachments more difficult to recognize are the ones that we can develop toward entirely good things.

Sometimes we can become attached to certain forms or practices of prayer, not only finding them personally beneficial, but perhaps coming to decide that they are essential, both to ourselves and others. We rightly enjoy the celebration of family traditions, but if those traditions become attachments, we then make ourselves miserable when the time comes to accept that they cannot always be carried on. And, of course, even Jesuits can become so attached to the good we have found in the teachings of St. Ignatius, that we might inadvertently begin to see those teachings as ends in themselves rather than useful paths toward God.

A few years ago I gave a talk on attachments at a retreat I helped lead. Afterward, I received a two-page hand-written letter from one of the retreatants expressing his displeasure that my talk took place in a social gathering room rather than in the retreat center's chapel where, he was morally certain, such talks *should* take place! I'm pretty sure he missed the point of my talk!

St. Ignatius spent years of his life founding and leading the Society of Jesus. And yet, he was known to say that if some future pope ever ordered the Jesuits to disband, he would need only about fifteen minutes of prayer to come to peace with that decision, and then move on with this life. Now *that* is freedom!

This Wednesday, July 31st, we join the Universal Church in celebrating what we affectionately refer to as St. Ignatius Day, the memorial of St. Ignatius Loyola. This year I will celebrate it asking him to pray that we might all be led on paths of greater interior freedom to live the life to which God calls us.



FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (FFF) AND TEEN CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

Registration is going on for ALL SMSP parish members for our FFF Programs: Pre-K through 7th Grade and Teen Confirmation, which is 8th Grade (High school students are welcome). Parish members whose eldest child will be 3-4 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2019 are eligible for our Pre-K classes.

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

This home-based program requires families to work together at home on lessons. Families meet one Sunday a month at the parish to build community and grow in faith formation and discipleship. We offer three sessions from October thru April: 8AM, 10AM and a Noon Session. In keeping with our SMSP Mission ten hours of volunteer service at SMSP per family is required. Regular Sunday Mass attendance is expected.

1ST RECONCILIATION/1ST COMMUNION

This program includes attendance at all FFF Sundays as well as one additional Sunday Parent/Child session per month in preparation for the Sacraments.
