Pastoral Perspective

A GREAT CLOUD OF WITNESSES

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." (Luke 1:46-47)

Do you ever find it hard to connect with these beautiful words of the Magnificat? In the wake of a loved one's passing or yet another mass

shooting, in the confusion of life transitions, or in our country's seemingly ever-growing division, it can be hard to rejoice. Yet: "Jesus said to his disciples: Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32, August 11).

So, amidst the world's pain, we lean into Jesus' words. And we start to notice the kingdom, to find reasons to rejoice.

I've noticed this hope recently in our Catholic community. As our suffering brothers and sisters arrive at our nation's door in great numbers, they are met with inhumane detention conditions and family separations. Seven children have died in US immigrations custody in 2018 and 2019, and many more in the journey north. However, Catholic individuals and organizations are standing up to say: Enough! ¡Basta!

On July 18, over 70 Catholics locked arms in the Russell Senate Office Building Rotunda in an act of nonviolent civil disobedience to call for an end to child detention, an immoral practice that breaks from Catholic Social Teaching. The 70+ inside, who were eventually arrested, were joined in prayer and peaceful protest by over 300 more Catholic lay and religious individuals outside the US Capitol. Our parish was among the many institutions that endorsed this Catholic Day of Action.

On July 30, nearly 500 Catholics, including a dozen St. Mary parishioners, celebrated Mass in Detroit for families in detention. The Mass was organized by Strangers No Longer (SNL), a network of southeast Michigan Catholic parishes supporting immigrants in our communities and at our borders. St. Mary actively participates in this grassroots network, aptly named after the 2003 USCCB Pastoral Letter on

caring for our brothers and sisters who are migrants. We work and pray incessantly to expand this network of solidarity.

Within St. Mary, our Immigration Team continues to grow, strengthening our ability to accompany parishioners and community members. Our Drivers Group recently completed its first full year, providing about 50 rides to fellow parishioners, and living the *encounter* to which Pope Francis calls us.

This spring, St Mary became a member of the Washtenaw Congregational Sanctuary (WCS), joining a dozen other local faith communities to save one man's life, and preparing to save more if needed. There are also efforts emerging through local groups, like WCS, to support asylum-seekers in detention in Michigan. (All are welcome to a fundraiser for asylum-seekers on August 15 - details in this bulletin).

And so, in our community, I see God's kingdom. Resounding deeply, the August 18 Hebrews passage encourages us: "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus."

Brothers and sisters - cloud of witnesses - let us continue to seek God's kingdom, to run the race together with our eyes fixed on Jesus.

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION (FFF) AND TEEN CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS SEPT 1, 2019 for our programs: Pre-K through 7th Grade and Teen Confirmation, which is 8th Grade (High school students are welcome). Parish members whose eldest child will be 3-4 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2019 are eligible for our Pre-K classes.

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION This home-based program requires families to work together at home on lessons. Families meet one Sunday a month at the parish to build community and grow in faith formation and discipleship. We offer three sessions from October thru April: 8AM, 10AM and a Noon Session. In keeping with our SMSP Mission ten hours of volunteer service at SMSP per family is required. Regular Sunday Mass attendance is expected.

1ST RECONCILIATION/1ST COMMUNION This program includes attendance at all FFF Sundays as well as one additional Sunday Parent/Child session per month in preparation for the Sacraments

TEEN CONFIRMATION Sacramental Preparation sessions will meet twice a month on Sunday afternoons. Attendance at the Fall Retreat and two Service Retreats are required in addition to regular attendance at Sunday Mass. Please register soon as space is limited.

FAITH FORMATION FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held once a month during the school year (Dates TBA) after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 AM-12:45 PM. It is a drop- off program. Materials cost is \$35 per child for the year and scholarships are available.


Thank you for your gifts to the Diocesan Services Appeal!


