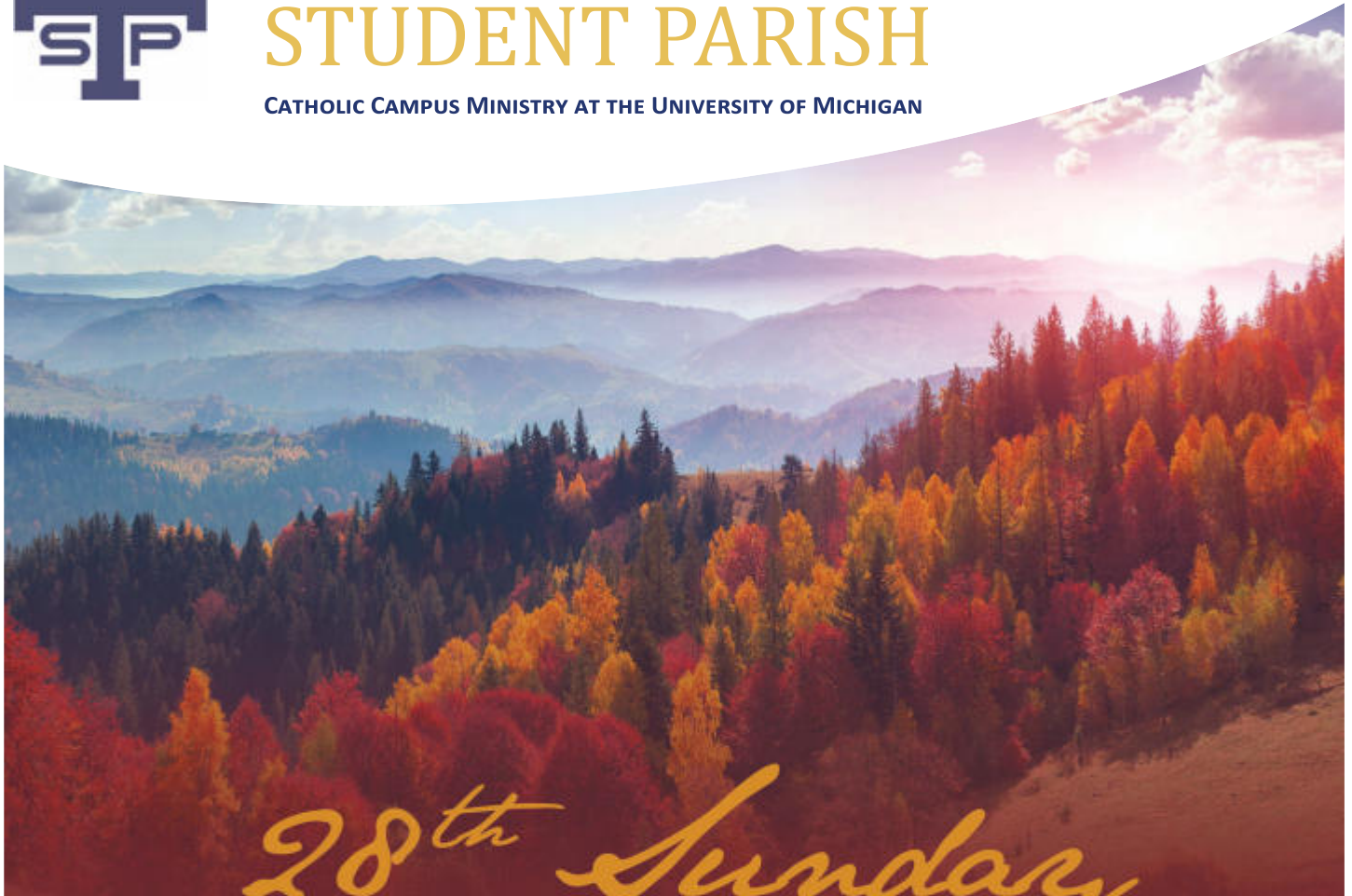

This is important legislation because Michigan was only one of four states not to have 18 as the age of adult jurisdiction. TRANSITIONS IN LIFE... A LIFE IN TRANSITION

Nowadays, perhaps more than in the past, life appears punctuated by a sequence of more or less momentous transitions. Yet, what really is a transition? How do we deal with transitions? HOW TO REPORT ABUSE

If you have been abused or victimized by someone representing the Catholic Church, we encourage you to come forward and speak out. Every diocese in the United States now has a victim assistance coordinator who is available to obtain support, to help make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese, and to arrange a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, if you desire.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?

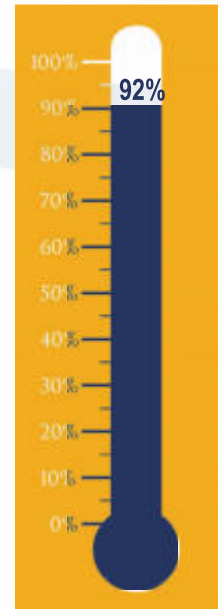

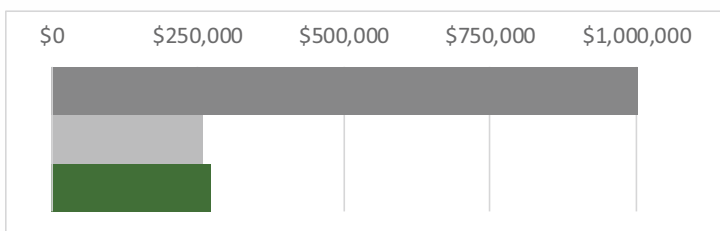
