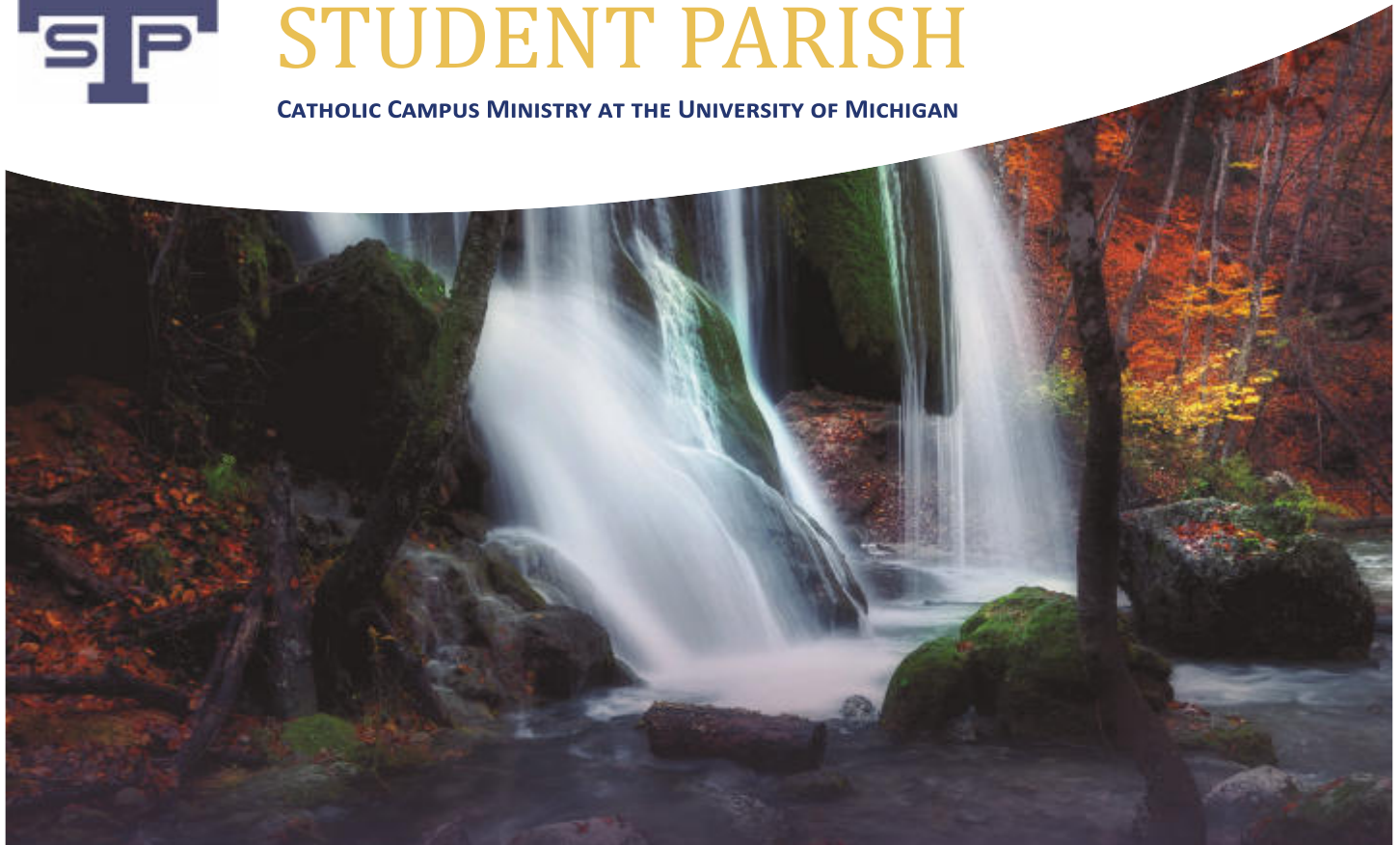

*Note: This Fall, our Small Church Communities are spending extra time in prayer and in studying God's Word together. We are including some "Thoughts for the Week" to help everyone in the parish lift their hearts in prayer as well.*

**"Pray always without becoming weary."**

Luke 18: 1-8

Jesus emphasizes the importance of prayer in our readings for the next couple of weeks. It's one of the best ways that we respond, and have a real relationship with God. Persistence in our prayer shows that we trust completely in what God wants to bring to us.

Scripture scholar Daniel Harrington, S.J. once wrote that we can "pray always" when we strive to make our whole life into a prayer. "This kind of prayer involves offering all that we are and have and do to the service of God, calling ourselves into the presence of God at various times during our day and making all our personal encounters and actions into a kind of prayer. This form of prayer means bringing all our successes and failures, joys and sorrows, and highs and lows to God in prayer."

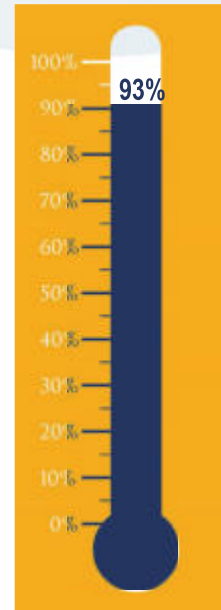

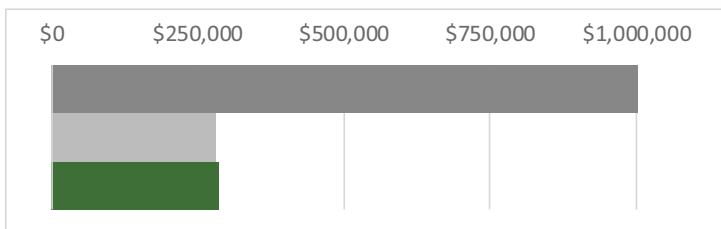


