OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

El dia de la Virgen de Guadalupe has had different significance throughout my life but it has always been one of the most important constants in my life. This day has helped me grow spiritually, grow as a person, and it has helped me stay connected to my roots.

December 12th is one of the most important days of the year for me, it's a day that connects me to my ancestry. The traditional clothing, the dances, and the music help me connect to my culture in a different way than the daily connection that I feel to my people. To know that I am a part of something that is happening in two different countries at once is incredible to me and it reminds me that I am a part of something bigger. Being away from home makes it difficult for me to stay connected to my community on a daily basis and it's difficult not having that same support system, but the festivities on the el dia de la Virgen de Guadalupe connect me and I don't feel like I'm far from home anymore. Being able to celebrate this day in a different state than my family helps me remember that being part of this community is about more than where you live. Besides connecting me to my roots el dia de la Virgen has helped me connect with my faith.

La Virgen has been an integral part of my spiritual growth and in my faith. For a while, I was struggling with my beliefs and the one belief that I could never let go and that helped guide me through my difficult time was La Virgen de Guadalupe. Through my struggles, I knew that she was there with me and that she was helping guide me back to my faith. My mom always told me growing up that regardless of what I could tell her that I had to remember that I could tell everything to La Virgen and that she would guide me. Having La Virgen to guide me helped me grow as a person and has been one of the greatest blessings in my life.

One of the biggest reasons why I feel a deep connection to La Virgen is because of the way in which she appeared. She came to this earth and showed us that even the ones that are believed to be insignificant can make an amazing difference. How your status in life does not matter in the plans of God and that we all matter. I have struggled with my identity as a Mexican American and La Virgen has been an integral part of accepting myself. She has guided me in realizing that regardless of my appearance and my language I matter and that I am not worth less than anyone else.


