

As the students were arriving to their Teen Confirmation Program, I was chatting with their catechists in Donnelly Hall. Our catechists are amazing people! One young man told me that in addition to his Sunday afternoons with us, he goes home each Saturday morning to teach first graders at his family's parish. After chatting with

them, I sauntered into our Hispanic Ministry Program where I met with another group of catechists. We have about 80 undergraduate and graduate catechists in our Family Faith Program. What a blessing! These young adults are passing on our Catholic faith to our children both in word and by example.

As we embrace this Advent season, I often think back to Mary and Joseph. They were simple people of faith who were chosen by God to bring Christ into the world. Not understanding all the implications of the mission God entrusted to them, they said, "yes, let God's will be done." Advent is a time to hear God asking us to do the same, to bring Christ into the world.

I am excited about our Campus Ministry Program and inspired by the synergy that exists between our parishioners and our college students. I pray that we live up to our mission of forming Catholic leaders, disciples of Jesus. I hope that St. Mary Student Parish is a place where we encounter God, and hear and accept his mission of bringing Christ to the world. May we live up to our mission of being an apostolic parish committed to the ongoing formation of Christian witness, discipleship, and leadership.

I find my prayer these days being of gratitude. I am thankful for being part of St. Mary Student Parish. There is always so much going on, all of you living a faith that does justice. We just had almost 200 hundred parishioners go out and serve on our feast day. Hundreds of gifts have come in these days for our Advent Giving Tree. We are preparing to welcome the homeless into our parish for the month of January. All of you make this possible. I am inspired each day by your faith and generosity. Thank you for saying yes to bringing Christ into the world. I thank God for leading me here.

As I mentioned in Masses a few weeks ago, our Annual Fund makes our Campus Ministry possible. Once a year, we reach

# **CAREER MENTORING PROGRAM**

The Parish Council is excited to announce a new program that will provide an opportunity for resident and student parish members to come together and discuss careers with

a spiritual perspective. This month, we will invite resident parishioners to sign-up to serve as mentors. In January, we will register interested students. By February we plan to assign mentoring pairs. We anticipate mentors and students meeting three times over the course of the year.

In addition to providing career guidance, we hope the mentoring pairs will explore questions such as:

- How should I prepare for the transition from school to professional life?
- How do you incorporate your spiritual beliefs into your career?
