


#### UNDERGRAD RETREATS FOR MEN AND WOMEN

There always seems to be plenty of fear to go around. Every generation, if it chooses, can live in a constant state of dread. And, unfortunately, there are always those in history willing to fuel others' fears to consolidate their power. This is why the presence of Christians around the world is so important. Over and over we are reminded in the Scriptures by prophets, angels and Jesus, "Do not be afraid." This is important because these words are not only words of comfort, but an affirmation of our faith, a reminder that the opposite of faith is not doubt, but fear. Our Christian calling is to cast out fear. We are meant to be beacons of hope in whatever time or place we find ourselves. But, still, sometimes we need to be reminded to be brave. And we have to choose again to be people of hope and joy.

Having just celebrated Christmas, and the beginning of a new year, we are riding a wave of faith, hope and joy, one that we would like to sustain even amidst the inevitable stresses and anxieties of our lives. One way that we can equip ourselves in this way is through prayer. This month, we are inviting our undergraduate students to our men's and women's retreats, both sharing the theme, "BE NOT AFRAID." These weekends will be a time to enter more deeply as a community into holy recreation and prayerful reflection on faith overcoming fear and leading us into a life of hope and joy. 


#### **GRAD/YP SPIRITUAL DIRECTIONS**



#### **INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP**

Those wishing to have their children baptized at SMSP should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 PM. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms on two Sundays a month at the 10:00 AM, 12:00 PM and 5:00 PM mass and on one Saturday a month at 1:00 PM. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.
