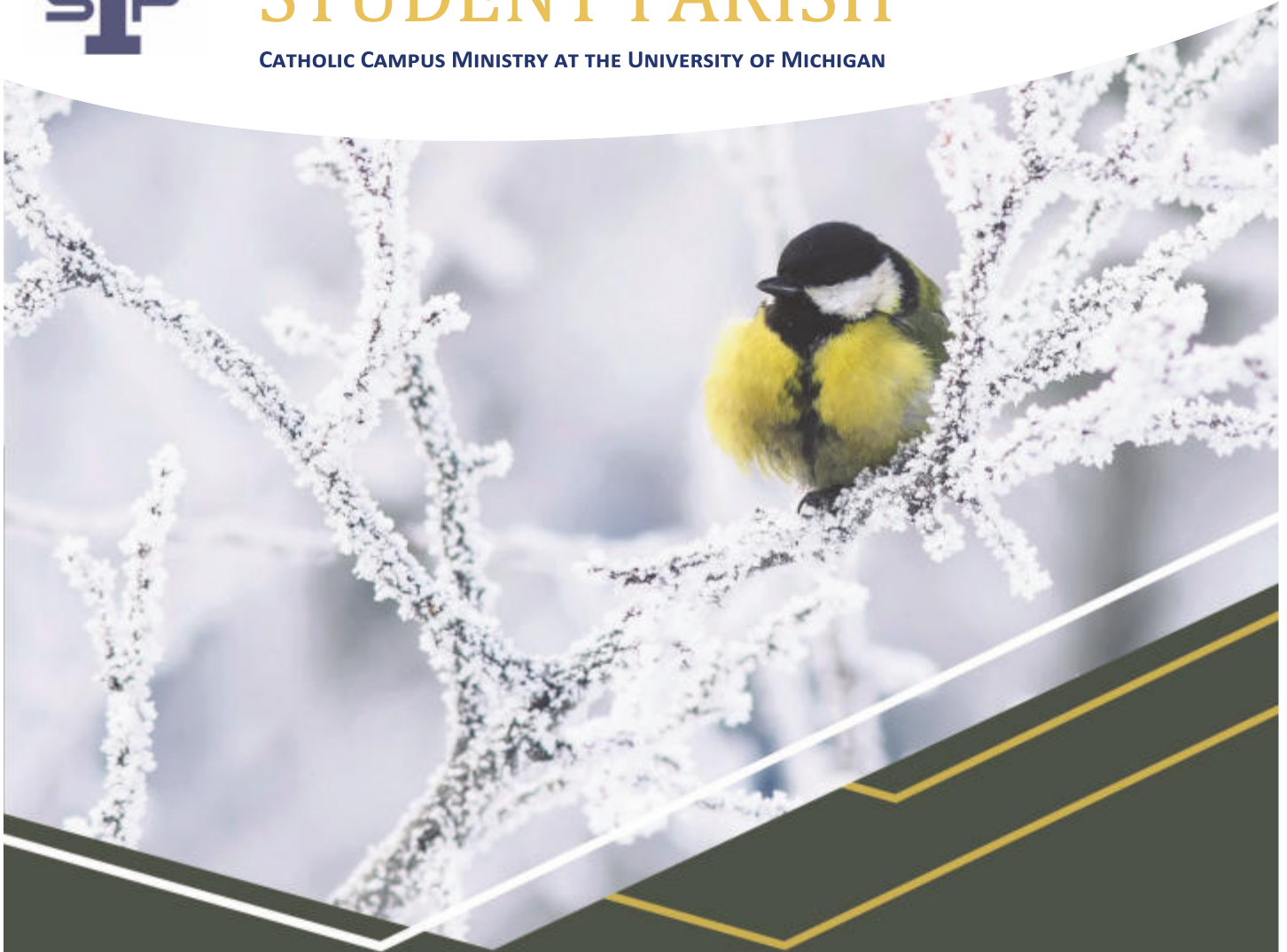

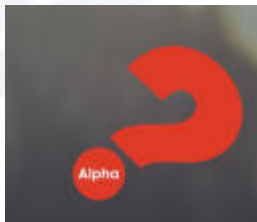

AN INVITATION TO ALPHA

We all love receiving invitations: to dinner, to the movies, or to an evening of conversation with friends. Alpha invites you to come together with others to do just that - share a meal, watch a film, and have

meaningful conversation. Alpha is a series of sessions, typically running over 11 weeks, that explores the basics of the Christian faith. It's a wonderful way to meet people and build community in a casual, informal setting. Everyone is welcome, students and resident parishioners alike.

Small groups join in casual conversation to discuss the topic of the night, as featured in the films, which are wonderfully produced and designed to engage and inspire conversation. They explore the big issues around faith and unpack the basics of Christianity, dealing with questions such as "Who is Jesus?" , "How can I have faith?"

Hospitality is at the heart of Alpha, so it is important that everyone feels welcome and comfortable. We strive to make this happen. There is no obligation to say anything. It is quite simply an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your personal perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment. There are no requirements other than to enjoy getting to know one another. Friendships will blossom and grow as the weeks go by.

Alpha is run in local communities all around the world and everyone is welcome. It runs in restaurants, churches, schools, homes – you name it. No two Alphas look the same, but each one does contain three key components: food, a film and good conversation.

INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.

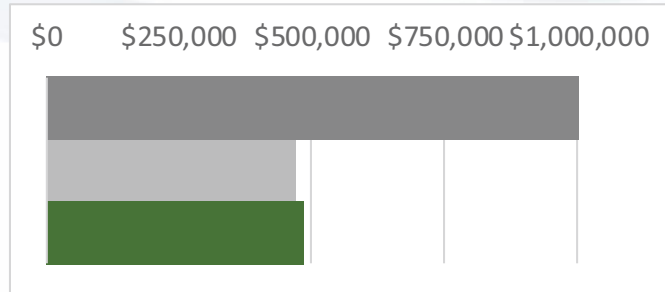

4 LEVELS OF HAPPINESS

SAT, JAN 25 AT ST. JOSEPH PARISH IN DEXTER

Presentation by Jim Berlucchi, Executive Director of the Spitzer Center, on how understanding happiness is key to understanding how to follow God's will and be a true disciple of Jesus Christ.
