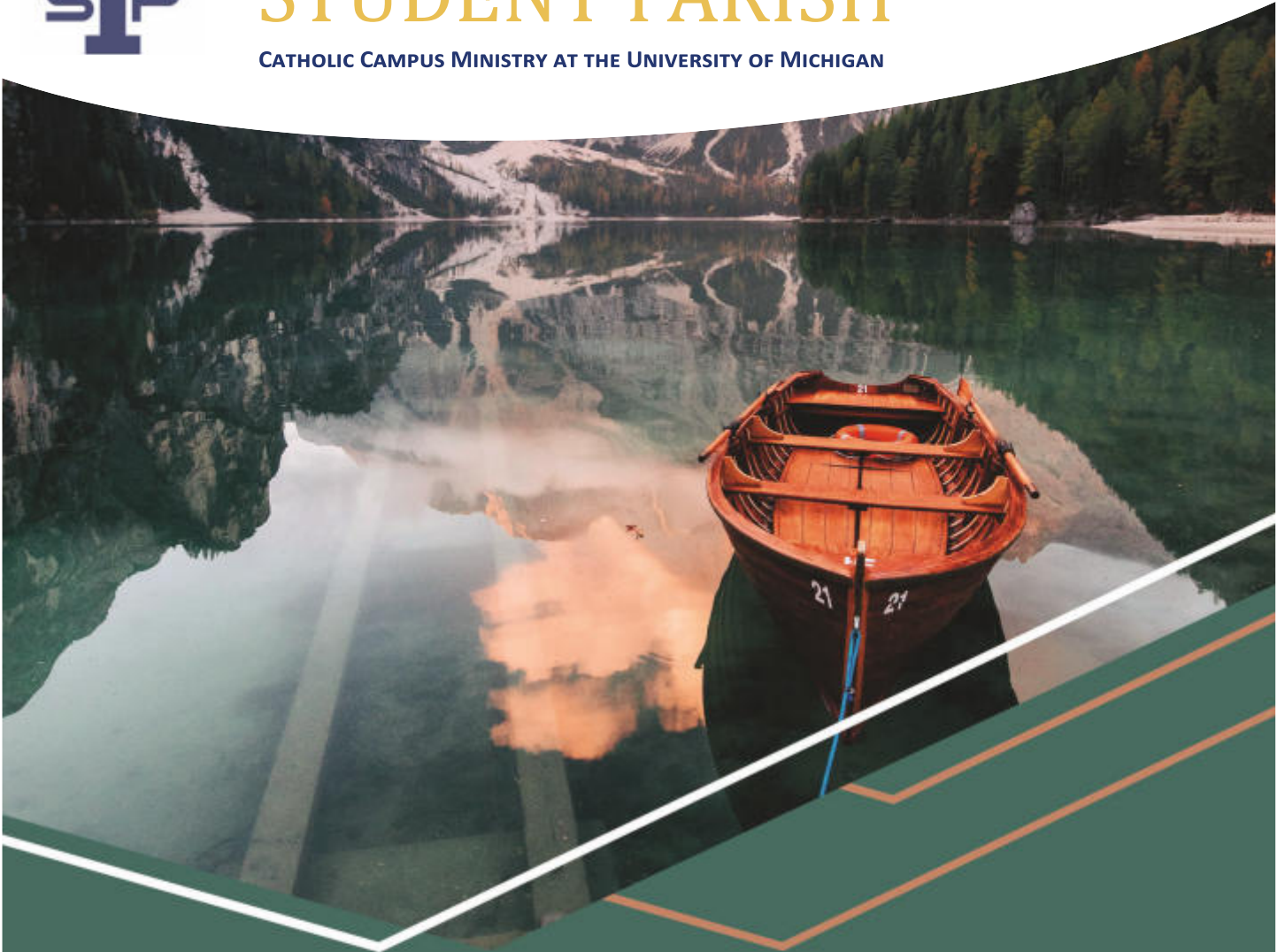

WHY SHOULD I JOIN A SMALL CHURCH COMMUNITY (SCC)?

Reasons to join an SCC:

- To have great conversations with people who love God
- To unplug from the world once a week, so you can focus on God more clearly
- To gain new sources for learning and reading (websites, prayers, etc.)
- To hear and understand different voices, ages, and perspectives
- To find comfort in community, and meet new friends
- To gain insight from knowing that God is active in your life and in the life of others
- To be more prepared for Mass, especially in understanding the readings
- To learn new methods of prayer and reflection

There are lots of reasons why people love joining a Small Church Community, or SCC. These are a few that I've heard mentioned in recent years. One participant this fall remarked, "This is what it means to be the church." I think that really touches on our belief that we do not live our faith alone, but always as part of a community that cares about God and each other.

Jesus lived and moved with his "spiritual friends" and we have a need to do that too. Sometimes people tell us (especially students) that they rarely have a chance to talk about God with anyone, so sharing in a small group feels refreshing and life-giving.

So this coming Lent, I invite you to prayerfully consider a group that fits your schedule. It's great to give something up for Lent, but why not also add something? An SCC group can enrich your life in growing closer to God through prayer, reflection and time spent with others.

Interested? Here's what it's all about:

- SCC sessions run twice a year at St. Mary. (Fall and Lent)
- The Lent session begins the week of Feb. 17 and runs for eight weeks. Groups will share faith experiences and reflect on the Sunday readings.
- Groups meet for 90 minutes once a week and there's one to fit most schedules.

DISCERNMENT OF SPIRITS SCC

As part of the Small Church Communities for Lent, we will once again host an Ignatian Topics group. This group, led by Etta MacDonagh-Dumler and Jim Manney, will be offered on Wednesday evenings.

The sessions will provide an *Introduction to Discernment of Spirits*, covering the Ignatian perspective on decision-making. St. Ignatius taught us that discernment is a way of life, not a set of techniques that we bring out of storage when we have to make an important decision. It's a skill that we can use every day.

This SCC will provide some perspectives and practices to enhance a person's ability to sense the Lord's leadings and to respond to them.

Join us for an examination and discussion of this important and, for some, controversial document. Over the course of these three evenings we will strive to do three things. First, we will read and discuss the document. What does it say and why? These sessions will be augmented by presentation and discussion around the science of climate change and other environmental problems that make up what scientists are now calling the Anthropocene. Second, we will reflect on what this document has to say for each of us in our own personal lives. Are there things we can change in our thinking, routines, consumption habits, travel or homes that can bring Pope Francis' ideas into our everyday lives? Third, we will discuss what this document might mean for the life of the parish. Should we be examining our energy and water use, our waste disposal, our material consumption? St. Mary has already committed to meet the Ann Arbor 2030 District program's goals of reducing building energy consumption, water use, and transportation emissions 50% by 2030. Is this enough? Is it too much?

The sessions will be moderated by Andy Hoffman, a long-time St. Mary parishioner and professor of business sustainability at the University of Michigan. INFANT BAPTISMS AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

For baptisms in English, we offer baptisms for one child only on most Sundays at 10:00 am, 12 noon and 5:00 pm. For baptisms in Spanish, we offer baptisms on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 2:00 PM Spanish mass.

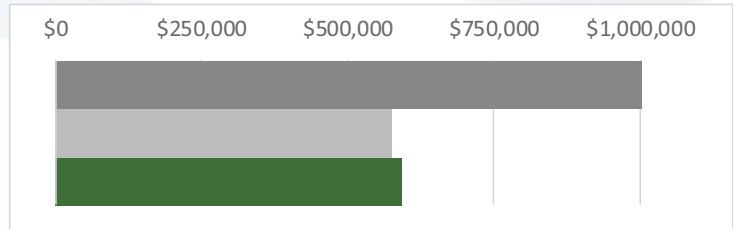
