

MY INTERNSHIP STORY...SO FAR

Prior to being a participant on St.
Mary's Alternative Spring Break trip
last year to Baltimore, Maryland,
I was not one of the students who
was very involved in the community
and events St. Mary has to offer.
I signed up for ASB at St. Mary on a
whim, encouraged by my older sister
who had been very involved in the
ASB program in previous years when
she attended

U of M. The week before spring break I truly started dreading the experience. The fear of going on a trip with eleven strangers became overwhelming. Still, I dragged myself to the car that morning headed for a nine-hour car ride to Baltimore.

I now realize how such a simple, albeit VERY resistant, response to God's pull in my life worked in subtle ways to completely upend and transform the life of what was then, sophomore year of college Rose-Carmel.

One of the fruits that came from the experience was a conversation with my site leader on the ride back from Baltimore. We started to talk about her time as an intern at St. Mary. I remember thinking during the conversation "See, I am so glad you had a wonderful experience, but I truly could never see myself in one of those positions." As the two of us, both talkative conversationalists, had 7 more hours in the car to fill, we continued to talk about her experience and the different internship ministries. Upon return to Ann Arbor, on what felt like another "whim" I ended up submitting my internship application the night the deadline was about to expire.

What I thought were random whims, I realize so clearly now was the Holy Spirit's direction in my life. Being the stewardship intern this year and sharing in the experience with my fellow intern cohort has been transformative in immense ways, many I realize I do not quite recognize yet. God has walked me through a journey of boundless healing and growth that never could have happened without the people that have listened, encouraged, and prodded me along the way through this internship experience.

There are many ways to become involved and grow as a student at St. Mary. I encourage you to consider even the ones that feel far-fetched or you may have previously written off. God is asking us to listen to his pull with an open heart and invites us to take a stab at the whims he presents to us. I take comfort in knowing He will undeniably meet us wherever we end up landing during the process.

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

Baptism preparation classes are held once a month on a Monday at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class they plan to attend. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.


