

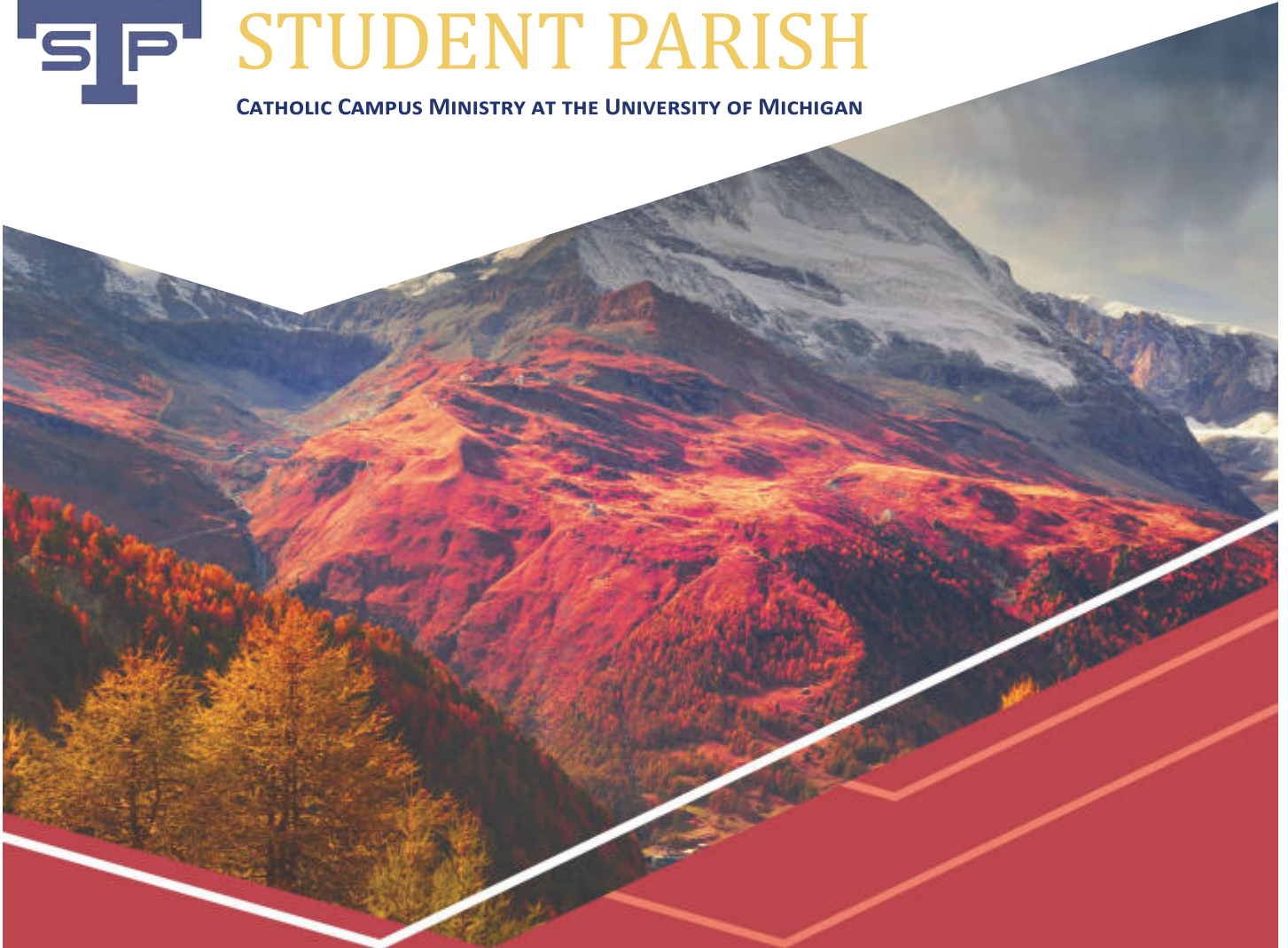

We have many different volunteer opportunities available!

- Welcome Host: Help with set up, welcoming guests, talking with guests, and assisting as needed.
- Overnight Host: Two overnight hosts must be awake at any given time during the night, so overnight hosts can take shifts on who is awake and who can sleep (in separate space from the guests). Also includes making coffee in the morning, waking guests up, and light clean up.
- Snacks (Monday-Friday): Juice, coffee, creamer, sugar, food for 25 men.
- Dinner (Saturday and Sunday): Food for 25 guests.

WHY DO MY PEOPLE FLEE?

A FIRST HAND REPORT FROM HONDURAS

Join us for an evening of understanding what is happening beyond our borders that causes so many people to leave their homes, families and cultures to make the perilous immigrant journey. Jesuit priest, Father Ismael Moreno (known to all as Padre Melo), is one of the foremost voices for human rights in his native Honduras. Close to the people most affected by oppression and poverty, Padre Melo is a soulful and brilliant analyst of the reality that the majority of Hondurans live. He is director of Radio Progreso/ERIC, a radio station center for reflection, research and communication at the service of the people throughout Honduras and Central America.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION FOR THE WEEK

Note: This Lenten season, our Small Church Communities are spending time in prayer and in studying God's Word together. Each week, we will include a brief reflection in the bulletin to help everyone in the parish lift their hearts in prayer as well.

Matthew 4: 1-11 (Jesus rejects the worldly temptations offered by the devil when he goes off to the desert to pray).

During his time alone with God, Jesus was directed to remain rooted and filled with the Spirit as he set out on his life of public ministry, just as we are called to do. Each of us has an inclination to want to rely on the worldly temptations – security, fame, success, while we may be ignoring the freedom that God offers us.

Our weaknesses and resentments (anger, jealousy, self-centeredness) can keep us from seeing and hearing God's presence in our lives. As we enter fully into Lent, we ask God to show us how we can follow Christ more closely. What are the demons we must name and face? Where in our lives do we need God's strength so we can feel empowered to go out and respond to God? How can I simplify my life this Lent (enter into the desert) so that I can hear God's voice more clearly?
