CHOOSE HOPE - A STUDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

With summer coming to a close and the beginning of my senior year at the University of Michigan looming on the horizon, the uncertainty and complications of the pandemic have begun setting in again. This past week, I was left saddened by the news of friends not returning to Ann Arbor for the year and the announcement of the majority of my

classes changing to completely remote settings. The realization of clubs canceling welcome week activities and many other highly anticipated social events has also made it very challenging to get excited about the new semester.

Through all these concerns, I found myself at the footsteps of St. Mary Student Parish for the first time in months, awaiting the start of the 5:10 Tuesday mass. Walking in the oh so familiar atrium doors nearly brought a tear to my eye as many memories associated with the parish filled my mind. Seeing the familiar faces of many resident parishioners I haven't seen since before the pandemic brought back the unmistakable welcoming feeling that the SMSP community radiates and left me filled with so much joy.

Although things looked different and the church was a little more empty than usual, kneeling before the altar brought me an incredible sense of peace and comfort. I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit stronger than I have felt in any prayer experience the past few months. I became overwhelmed with gratitude for the many hours I have spent in that chapel and for the community and opportunities that St. Mary Student Parish has provided me over the past three years.

This week we celebrated the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We heard the reading of the Visitation of Mary with Elizabeth as recorded in the Gospel of Luke where the infant in Elizabeth's womb leaps with joy at the presence of Jesus in Mary's womb.

When praying the rosary, the Joyful Mystery of the Visitation is always my favorite reflection. I think about how Jesus is present in so many hidden places in this world, just as he was in Mary's womb and how we also can be overcome with Joy by encountering him in these places, just as John the Baptist was.

This is how I felt walking into St. Mary's once again this week; Overcome with a joy that is only possible in the presence of Jesus. I was reminded of the uncertainty that Mary experienced while bearing Jesus and how she responded with faith and complete trust in God.

As we transition into the uncertainty of the fall, we must be reminded of Mary's example and remain hopeful. Let us lean on our parish's patron saint as a source of comfort, consolation and strength during these hard times and offer these graces to those around us.

BAPTISM CLASS—ENGLISH

A baptism preparation class will be held once or twice a month. Classes are limited to 4 families, masks and proper social distancing is required. If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

Class dates are: August 17, September 21, October 5 & 19 and November 2. Pre-registration is required. Please call the parish office to register: 734-663-0557 x 0.

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish. To arrange a baptism and to begin the preparation, please contact the parish office.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has recently redesigned their website and have added a robust Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism which seeks "to teach about and to witness the intrinsic dignity of the human person as an antidote to the grave sin of racism."

"Racism is a sin: a sin that divides the human family, blots out the image of God among specific members of that family, and violates the fundamental human dignity of those called to be children of the same Father." (Brothers and Sisters to Us, 1979). Racism lives in a particular and pernicious way in the United States, in part because of the complex history of slavery in the country, and the beliefs and policies that sustained it. African Americans have suffered intensely from those who have committed, and continue to commit, the sin of racism. But racism has also ravaged the lives and livelihoods of many other groups of people, and its targets and destructive manifestations are ever-evolving.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism seeks to teach about and to witness to the intrinsic dignity of the human person as an antidote to the grave sin of racism. The Committee explores and implements concrete solutions to address the racism that still pervades our society and our Church today, and works in collaborative ways to strengthen the response of all people to this evil.

An update from Matthew Hufnagel, Vice President of Development, The Catholic Foundation




