JESUS IS WITH US VIRTUALLY, TOO

Imagine my smile when I looked at today's Gospel reading from Matthew. It's just perfect for an article about our Small Church Communities.

"If two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are

gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (MT 18: 19-20)

While it's not as easy for two or three of us to gather safely these days, we can still connect, pray and share in a virtual format. That's the way our Small Church Communities, or SCCs, will look for this Fall Session. One benefit to this format is that you won't have to leave the house to join in. People who find transportation or childcare difficult will be able to choose an online group and connect from home.

St. Mary has hosted SCCs, for many years. These gatherings continue to help people feel more rooted in scripture, and provide an understanding of how others process the joys and challenges of living as followers of Christ. One of our students, Michael Klettner, sent us a note about what his undergrad SCC meant to him last semester: "The discussions that we had and the conversations that took place were simply incredible," he said, "and certainly a place where Christ was present."

NOVENA FOR RACIAL JUSTICE

On July 10, Ignatian Solidarity Network began a Novena for Racial Justice. In the Catholic tradition, a Novena is an ancient prayer tradition, consisting of prayer for a specific intention over the course of nine days. This Novena is framed in the example of Catholic saints and servants of God who provide a witness and example for us in our work for racial justice.

Why saints? Catholic tradition also includes the concept of “the communion of saints”—meaning the community of holy people, both living and dead, who we often call upon to intercede, or pray, for us in our times of need. We call on this tradition in this Novena for Racial Justice, asking for the prayers of saints and servants of God who have died to help us obtain the graces needed to persevere in our own internal and external work for racial justice.

Please pray for the Diocese of Lansing's 31 seminarians who begin a new academic year this week, including 11 new starts – the largest intake of new seminarians in over a decade. *Deo gratias!*

"The Lord is abundantly blessing the Diocese of Lansing this year and we pray that these young men will have the grace to pursue their priestly vocation if God is indeed calling them to the priesthood," said Father John Whitlock, Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Lansing, September 1.

At present, the Diocese of Lansing seminarians are sent to study at three different seminaries: 14 are in formation at Saint John Vianney College Seminary in Saint Paul, Minnesota; 16 are in formation at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, Michigan; and one is in formation at the Pontifical North American College in Rome.

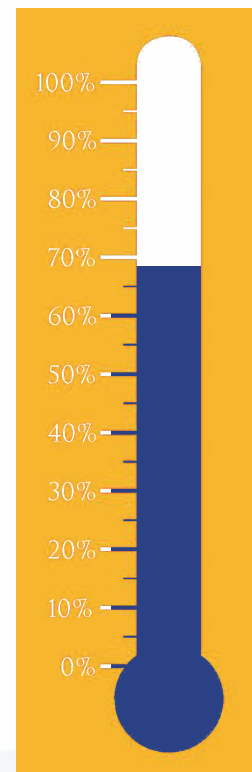
