## **Pastoral Perspective**

### CONSULTING OUR PERSONAL COMPASS

In these days when life seems to be spinning all over the place, I recently found an idea that can help us feel more grounded. It's a meditation that looks at our own spiritual, or personal compass. This exercise really struck me.

Looking at our personal compass – as a kind of navigational tool - can help us to

see where we need to turn in order to have greater balance and wholeness – and to stay on the path that leads us closer to God.

Here's how it works: Draw a circle and break it into the four directions (leave room in the center). For each direction, write down some thoughts or feelings about your life. Here are some guidelines:

Start with the East, the direction of the rising sun. Where are you being called to embrace something new? Are you aware of areas in your life that need healing or change?

The West represents the setting sun, so write down the attitudes, beliefs, behaviors that you may want to end things that might need some letting go.

For the North, include what represents your guiding light. Who are your spiritual mentors? What values, teachings, or images of God guide and nurture you?

The South area (your sunny exposure) might represent your longings, hobbies - the things that give you joy and energy in life.

In the Center – write or draw your image of an unconditional yes to living your life fully. What does a wholehearted yes to God (physically, mentally and spiritually) look like?



For me, the idea of a compass helps with our "wakefulness," or paying attention to God's active presence in every part of our lives. (It's similar to the Examen prayer suggested by St. Ignatius of Loyola). Also, we can't control the external things that shape our lives, but we can stay true to the workings of our heart, and the longings that direct us on a clear path toward God. If our longings are taking us a bit astray, maybe it's time for some re-orienting.

### **HAPPY FEAST DAY, ST. FRANCIS!**

And by the way, since today is the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi, I wanted to include a prayer inspired by his life and work. St. Francis taught us to honor and love nature and animals, another way to align ourselves with our Creator God.

Gracious God, I thank you that I, and all my fellow creatures, my brothers and sisters, are wonderfully made. When I realize that I am your creature, beautiful and good, I feel whole, aand sense that I am part of all that you have made, and I am recharged by the grandeur I (From Franciscanmedia.org) experience.

During these next few weeks, more than 100,000 individuals in 800 walks nationwide will come together to raise funds to assist the world's hungry people through Church World Service (CWS) hunger inequality programs and local food insecurity programs. In January 2020, the number of food insecure people in the U.S. was at its lowest (37 million) since the Great Depression, but this number is estimated to have grown by half to 54 million in these six months of the Covid-19 pandemic. It is estimated 18 million children are now food insecure.

### **USCCB AD HOC COMMITTEE AGAINST RACISM**

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has recently redesigned their website and has added a robust Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism which seeks "to teach about and to witness the intrinsic dignity of the human person as an antidote to the grave sin of racism."

From their website: https://www.usccb.org/committees/ad-hoc-committee-against-racism:

"Racism is a sin: a sin that divides the human family, blots out the image of God among specific members of that family, and violates the fundamental human dignity of those called to be children of the same Father." (Brothers and Sisters to Us, 1979). Racism lives in a particular and pernicious way in the United States, in part because of the complex history of slavery in the country, and the beliefs and policies that sustained it. African Americans have suffered intensely from those who have committed, and continue to commit, the sin of racism. But racism has also ravaged the lives and livelihoods of many other groups of people, and its targets and destructive manifestations are ever-evolving.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism seeks to teach about and to witness to the intrinsic dignity of the human person as an antidote to the grave sin of racism. The Committee explores and implements concrete solutions to address the racism that still pervades our society and our Church today, and works in collaborative ways to strengthen the response of all people to this evil.

## CONTEMPLATION AND POLITICAL ACTION: AN IGNATIAN GUIDE TO CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

The Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States reflects on our Gospel call to promote the common good in the public square.

While the document's authors know that many Catholics are reluctant to mix faith and politics, they hope that its approach will resonate with that audience. The guide does not include lists of political positions to take as a Catholic, but it suggests opportunities for personal engagement through reflection questions, prayer prompts and anecdotes.

Contributor Father Penton explains that "faithful Catholics support different candidates and policies. To us, that's not a reason to not engage in politics. That's a reason to be more reflective, to be more prayerful, to enter into dialogue about how our faith informs our politics. It is not a reason to retreat from politics."

This year the prestigious Thomas

Moore Award will be given to **FR. THOMAS M. FIRESTONE** via live stream at the Diocese of Lansing

For nearly nine centuries, the celebration of the Red Mass has served to invoke the blessing of the Holy Spirit on the works of the courts in the new term.

Due to Covid, there will be no dinner reception following the Mass.

Fr. Firestone was born in Ida, Michigan. He was ordained for the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, received a Masters of Divinity and a Masters of Religious Education.

Fr. Firestone was assigned as chaplain at the Abbey of Regina Laudis. He has worked on behalf of the Bishops of the Heartland Association in trying to maintain family farms. He received a Masters of Science from Michigan State University in Agriculture and a JD from Thomas M. Cooley Law School. He founded Alma Redemptoris Mater, which is an interface between religious and diocesan priesthood.

In 2014 Bishop Boyea assigned him to be the pastor for the Catholic Community of Flint which included four parishes. In 2015, he created a community of diocesan priests to work with the people of Flint. They engage with the people of the city and try to embrace each relationship given through the Holy Spirit. Due to the water crisis they placed the city under the patronage of Holy Mary Mother of Flint. In 2016, Bishop Boyea approved this title and icon.




