DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS

Across the Americas, Catholics celebrate All Saints Day / All Souls Day / Day of the Dead similarly, but with unique variations from culture to culture. In my country, Ecuador, we usually bring flowers to decorate tombs, and tell stories of loved ones. Later, we drink la colada morada (a thick, purple drink made of corn flour, fruits and spices) with a bread called guagua, in the shape of a baby, or guagua, as infants are called in the Ecuadorian mountains. We have a Mass commemorating our loved ones' entrance into Heaven. We remember those who aren't with us with displays of love and affection, because those who have passed aren't really gone, so long as we keep remembering them here on Earth! Their absence is felt more deeply.

It is easier to talk about losing someone when they are not family or close loved ones. However, it invokes nostalgia and sadness to know you will never physically see your mom, dad, husband, child, brother, or friend again. The first few days are unsettling. Despite how little or how great your faith, you can feel lost and in much pain at first.

As time goes on, for some reason, you begin to feel that your loved one lives in your heart and you have them closer to you than before. Still, the waves come and go, for as human beings, we need to hear their voice and feel their physical presence. That's when you open the door and decide to have Faith and Hope that we all are destined for Eternity, and to get there we must pass through death.

Today, I imagine my father and my brother hugging, happy and without pain, and without any limits like time. All Souls Day is the feast day of those who are no longer physically with us. I look toward Heaven and wonder when I will reach that Eternity filled with joy and the presence of God. Only God knows when that day will be, but now we must remember those who have left us with love and a smile, because they would surely want to share a bit of their happiness with us.

Angelica Barba is the mother of Ernesto, Matthew, and Amaia and the wife of Walter. She thanks God every day

for the family they have built, as marriage reinvents itself daily with the help and strength of the Lord. A year ago she moved to Colorado, but has stayed connected with Mass, the Spanish Small Church Community and other virtual opportunities at St. Mary. Earlier this year, Angelica lost her brother to COVID-19.

WHAT IS DACA? WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) was implemented in 2012 as a policy to protect undocumented immigrants who were brought to this country as minors, due to a lack of a legislative action by Congress. Under this policy, they are provided with work authorization and protection from deportation. The current administration attempted to end DACA on September 5, 2017. In a decision issued on June 18, 2020, the Supreme Court issued a ruling that has at least temporarily prevented the Administration from ending the program. 'Dreamers' was an older term coined in 2001 to refer broadly to all undocumented immigrants brought to the U.S. as minors.

Although the DACA program is safe for the time being, it is essential that Congress pass a law that will provide more permanent protection to DACA and Dreamer individuals! Revised immigration laws could help protect and liberate DACA individuals, and stabilize families, communities and local economies across the country.

There are approximately 700,000 active DACA individuals in the U.S.; about 5,300 in Michigan.

DACA recipients are generally either enrolled in school or contribute to the labor force, many of whom are considered 'essential' workers.

If the DACA program is terminated, the country would suffer tremendous economic losses, with tens of thousands of educated and employed individuals and tax payers forced to leave this country – the only country they have known. The devastation brought on to these individuals and their families would be immoral, at best.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

As concerned Catholics following the social teachings of the Church, we must support our DACA brothers and sisters who are residents of the U.S. and live and work in our own communities. We can do this through prayer, standing in solidarity, and advocating!

POLITICAL ENGAGEMENT AND OUR BAPTISMAL CALL

In their statement on *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the U.S. Catholic bishops remind Catholics about the call to participate in political life. "In the Catholic tradition," they write, "responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation" (no. 13). Visit <https://www.usccb.org/offices/justice-peace-human-development/forming-consciences-faithful-citizenship> today to read the statement, along with a new letter, watch new videos, and access other great resources.

As Catholics, we are part of a community with profound teachings that help us consider challenges in public life, contribute to greater justice and peace for all people, and evaluate policy positions, party platforms, and candidates' promises and actions in light of the Gospel in order to help build a better world

Catholic voters should use Catholic teaching to examine candidates' positions on issues and should consider candidates' integrity, philosophy, and performance. It is important for all citizens "to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest" (USCCB, *Living the Gospel of Life*, no. 33).

In light of Catholic teaching, the bishops vigorously repeat their call for a renewed politics that focuses on moral principles, the promotion of human life and dignity, and the pursuit of the common good. Political participation in this spirit reflects not only the social teaching of our Church but the best traditions of our nation.
