

## 31ST ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATHS OF THE UCA MARTYRS OF EL SALVADOR, AND LAUNCHING OF "VAMOS A LA MILPA"

In honor of the 31st anniversary of the death of the Jesuit Martyrs, their housekeeper and her daughter who were killed at the University of Central America in El Salvador on Nov. 16, 1989, the University of Detroit Mercy is hosting a Webinar event on Nov. 16, 2020 from 7 to 9 pm. Our two featured speakers are Joseph Mulligan, SJ from Nicaragua (who will speak on the significance of the recent convictions in Spain of the Jesuits' killers) and Padre Melo, SJ of Honduras (who will speak on his new social justice project "Vamos a la Milpa"). Other guests will be Amy Argenal, who teaches Global Migration, Human Rights, and Critical Diversity Studies at University of San Franciso, and Jose Artiga, Director of SHARE El Salvador.

We will also have a dramatic reading of the words of the UCA Martyrs, prepared by **Mary Anne Perrone** (SMSP parishioner) and performed by University of Detroit Mercy community members.



#### **Around The Diocese**



#### **EVER WONDERED HOW DEACONS ARE FORMED?**

The National Directory for the Formation, Ministry, and Life of Permanent Deacons in the United States (USCCB 2004) has an incredibly detailed description of the qualities a man should possess when ordained a permanent deacon: 23 pages worth!

However, it has extraordinarily little to say about how to instill and develop these qualities during diaconal formation. All it says is that the process is to be determined by the local ordinary, in our case, Bishop Boyea.

This makes sense. The formation paths around the world will vary widely based on geography, culture, and available resources. The local bishop knows his diocese and as such is positioned to guide the formation of his deacons.

In the Diocese of Lansing there are two components to a man's journey to the permanent diaconate. The first is educational and the second is formational.

The educational component requires obtaining the equivalent of a bachelor or master's degree in systematic theology. This represents from 36-42 college credit hours. Its purpose is to ensure that a man has a dogmatically sound, deep theological knowledge base to draw upon in diaconal service.


The formation component lasts four years. It involves a wide range of activities in the parish, at the diocese and in the marketplace directed at forming a man in four ways; humanly, spiritually, intellectually, and pastorally, to prepare him for the complexities of diaconal service.

Consider that when next you see a deacon from the Diocese of Lansing, you are looking at a man who has invested 7-8 years preparing for diaconal ministry.

## BISHOP BOYEA'S YEAR OF THE BIBLE

Each day, the Bishop will text or email a chapter of Sacred Scripture. Together with the Bishop – and all those taking part – you will then read it and meditate upon it. Over the weeks, Bishop Boyea will also text you invitations to events; share video reflections with you; and let you know about other Year of the Bible updates. 
