Pastoral Perspective

WHERE DO I STAND?

As Lent rolls around each year, we often take a look at our faith and ask, “What can I do to be a better follower of Christ?”

This year – a year of greater awakening and focus on racial justice issues and the need for systemic reform – our parish is deepening this focus too. Our Small Church Communities will be looking at the Sunday

readings, and adding in some specific reflections on Catholic Social Teaching principles.

Sometimes people are surprised to learn that the Church has taken a stand on justice issues for more than a hundred years. One of the first encyclicals on labor and the rights of workers came in 1891 (Rerum Novarum, Pope Leo XIII). Our current focus on social justice isn’t something new, or radical for the Church.

If we’re following Christ, and Christ’s teachings, we’re praying and working toward a more equitable, and just society. That starts by looking inward.

“Where do I stand?” This question is important right now – whether it’s about racism, or even my faith in general. In other words, “Am I responding generously to God’s abundant love?”

To help with these questions, we’ve got a few options:

Sign up for a Small Church Community and study the Sunday readings as you share your experiences of God with others. SCC groups are available to fit a variety of schedules.

The Busy Person’s Retreat is for students, grad students and young professionals. Participants commit to pray 15 to 25 minutes each day during Lent, and meet once a week with a spiritual companion. (We’ll match you with one of our experienced companions who will help and encourage you).

The Big Read: Details on the selected book will be coming on this later.

One of our students had this to say about the Busy Person’s Retreat: “Each time, I gained something new. I discovered a new way to pray. I made an important decision guided by my faith, and I learned where God was reaching out to me in my everyday life.”

So ask yourself, “Where do I stand?” “Am I ready for a small group experience that will help me to pray more, and deepen my friendship with God?” If so, we hope you’ll prayerfully

consider one of these options. SCC groups and the BPR will meet virtually beginning the week of **February 7 through Palm Sunday, March 28**. For more information contact me at rzyber@smspnewman.org

PARISHIONERS AND STUDENTS CAN NOW SIT TOGETHER IN HOUSEHOLD GROUPS WHEN ATTENDING MASS HERE AT ST. MARY. Proper social distancing is still important so we ask everyone to please follow these instructions.

▪ Chairs are arranged in rows of 8 on each side of the main aisle with shorter rows on the sides of the altar.

▪ SEATS ARE FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE. WHEN CHOOSING YOUR SEATS THERE MUST BE 4 EMPTY SEATS BETWEEN YOU AND ANYONE ELSE IN THE SAME ROW.

▪ Mass will still end with Communion. Follow the celebrant's instructions for receiving Communion.

▪ Masks are required to be worn during the entire Mass and must cover both your nose and mouth.

▪ Reservations will be limited to registered parishioners and students.

▪ Since we do not have pews, seating will be 60 individual chairs.

▪ We strongly discourage those with compromised immune systems or families with small children from attending mass.

Thank you to all who participated in the Realign Resources for Mission parish meetings which have now concluded after two months consulting with parishioners across the Diocese of Lansing, both in-person and virtually (such are the COVID times in which we live!) In total, there were 67 meetings with over 2,600 parishioners participating and approximately 1,700 surveys submitted to the committee. We are currently reading every survey as we develop our proposals, which

will come to you for comment, before going to Bishop Boyea for final consideration. The Bishop has also given us an extension to complete our work which is now due June 1, 2021. In the meantime, I recommend you watch the latest Diocese of Lansing podcast which gives a good overview of the Realign Resources for Mission principles; a flavor of what parishioners had to say about them; and an explanation of the next steps for the process.
