Pastoral Perspective

BIG READ-“READING RACIAL JUSTICE”

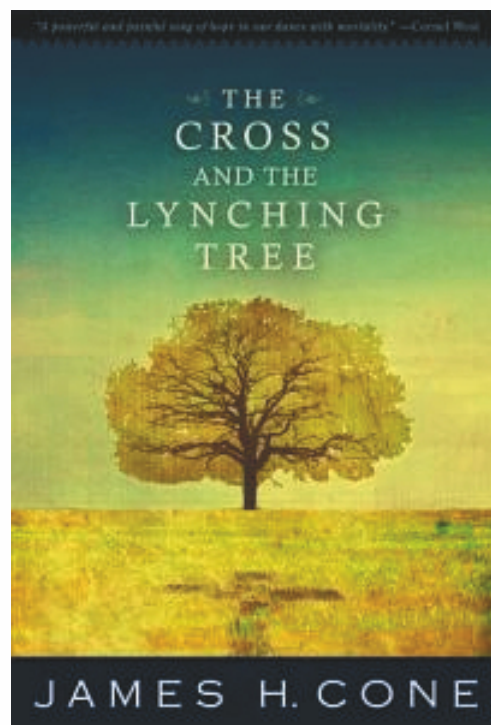
As the events of the past year have made painfully clear, people of color continue to face unjust racial discrimination in our communities. In the streets and on social media, prophetic voices bore witness to a call for liberation from the evils of white supremacy. For many this past year came with a difficult revelation—that racism continues to infect our church, our neighborhoods, and our hearts. Yet naming this reality is only a starting point. As Christians, we recognize Jesus’s continual call to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.

This year’s parish Big Read seeks to engage with our need for reconciliation and conversion. Using James Cone’s book *The Cross and the Lynching Tree*, we will explore the relationship between the Christ’s cross and this cross which Black communities have long had to bear. As Cone writes in the introduction to the book, “Until we can see the cross and the lynching tree together, until we can identify Christ with a ‘recrucified’ black body hanging from a lynching tree, there can be no genuine understanding of Christian identity in America, and no deliverance from the brutal legacy of slavery and white supremacy.” Cone’s testimony invites us into the difficult and necessary work of reconciliation, asking us with the voice of the prophet Joel to rend our hearts.

Over the course of this Lent, there will be several opportunities to meet online with other members of St. Mary for prayer and reflection. Additionally, parishioners and students will offer weekly reflections that will be available on the St. Mary website in both English and Spanish, along with links to other online resources on racial justice. If you are interested in sharing a reflection,

assisting with an event, or compiling digital or print resources on racial justice, please send an email to ncortas@smspnewman.org. St. Mary is purchasing books from Black Stone Bookstore, an African American-owned bookstore in Ypsilanti. Copies will be available in the parish office for purchase. While *The Cross and the Lynching Tree* is only published in English, throughout Lent St. Mary will provide reflections and other resources on racial justice in Spanish on our website. Check the parish website or next weekend’s bulletin for more information about the Big Read, including when and where books will be available for pick-up.

PARISHIONERS AND STUDENTS CAN NOW SIT TOGETHER IN HOUSEHOLD GROUPS WHEN ATTENDING MASS HERE AT ST. MARY. Proper social distancing is still important so we ask everyone to please follow these instructions.

▪ Chairs are arranged in rows of 8 on each side of the main aisle with shorter rows on the sides of the altar.

▪ **SEATS ARE FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE. WHEN CHOOSING YOUR SEATS THERE MUST BE 4 EMPTY SEATS BETWEEN YOU AND ANYONE ELSE IN THE SAME ROW.**

▪ Mass will still end with Communion. Follow the celebrant's instructions for receiving Communion.

▪ Masks are required to be worn during the entire Mass and must cover both your nose and mouth.

▪ Reservations will be limited to registered parishioners and students.

▪ Since we do not have pews, seating will be 60 individual chairs.

▪ We strongly discourage those with compromised immune systems or families with small children from attending mass.

ASH WEDNESDAY & DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES

Please be aware that, due to the current health situation, the distribution of ashes requires some restrictions this year. In particular, please note the following.

Ashes will be sprinkled silently

The Vatican has directed that ashes should be administered by sprinkling on the top of the head rather than traced on the forehead. This has long been the customary practice at the Vatican and in Italy even in ordinary times. Given the spread of the coronavirus, the practice has the advantage of not requiring the priest to touch multiple people. The invitation to “Remember that you are dust...” or “Repent and believe...” will be made to all present at once, and not repeated to each individual. More information on this can be found here:

Many individuals, groups and teams are taking advantage of the pandemic to bless two entities when hosting a meal for Alpha House by ordering dinner for us through take-out or delivery of a local restaurant. Many others are still planning and preparing at home. Both are welcomed! We usually feed on average 20 people. Making some meals kid-friendly is a bonus. A protein, carb, and vegetable are the main components for the meals.

If you prefer to bring your donation inside their building, we ask that you place it inside our first set of doors, in our vestibule. Staff will then retrieve your donation from there.

If you prefer contactless, please call Alpha House's front desk 734.822.0220 when you are a few minutes away from our building. The staff will put a service cart out front for you. Once you arrive, fill the cart. After you leave, the staff will retrieve your donation. Note! If you're calling and no one answers, it's likely our staff has been pulled away from the front desk attending to our families needs. Simply wait a few minutes and call back.

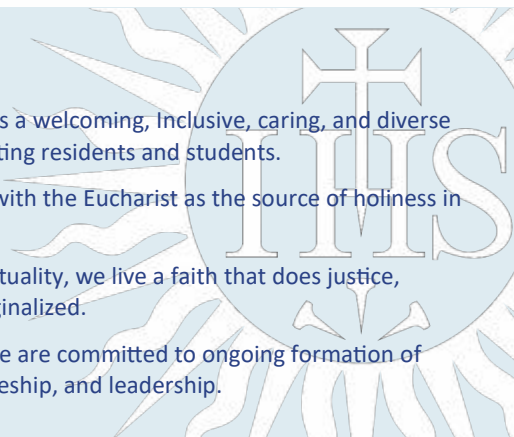
