Pastoral Perspective

FROM DUST YOU CAME, DUST, YOU SHALL RETURN

From dust you came, dust, you shall return. It is that time in the liturgical year again, The time for greater intimacy with God, The time to read the Bible and pray more, The time to achieve means to grow closer to God the Father,

The time to make sacrifices, The time for reconciliation, The time for reflection on Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time of repentance. It is an opportunity to be aware of the sins that separate us from God and us to reunite with Him. Lent is an opportunity to examine what the Lord did for us sinners on the cross. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent--a 40-weekday period of penitence and fasting.

Among the numerous beautiful, meaningful, and solemn celebrations of Christ in the Catholic Church is the gathering of God's children on Ash Wednesday. During Ash Wednesday mass, ashes are distributed as a symbol to remind us of what God created us from and prompt us to what we become when we die. As we read in Genesis, "Then the Lord God formed the man from the dust of the ground. He breathed the breath of life into man's nostrils, and the man became a living person" (Genesis 2:7). And "By the sweat of your brow will you have food to eat until you return to the ground from which you were made. For you were made from dust, and to dust, you will return" (Genesis 3:19).

I have been participating in this season for as long as I can remember. Each year's experience is different from the last. However, as I began to understand the season's doctrine, one thing remains true with Ash Wednesday; it is an opportunity for us as human beings to be humble. It reminds me of what Abraham told God in Genesis 18:27, "I am nothing but dust and ashes." If we understand this much, we ought to do our part as Christians to recognize human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God.

So, as we enter into this period of sacrifice, starting with Ash Wednesday, I implore you to take a moment and allow yourself to walk with God. Make this period yours and make efforts to replicate the hardships felt by Jesus during his time from the feast of the triumphant entrance to His resurrection. Let him hold your hand, let him open your heart, let him open your mind, and journey with him side-by-side, experiencing all his sacrificial love, mercy, and forgiveness. I pray that, as we experience different changes with this year, this season will bring you further insights drawing you closer to God.

ASH WEDNESDAY DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES

Please be aware that, due to the current health situation, the distribution of ashes requires some restrictions this year. In particular, please note the following.

Ashes will be sprinkled silently

The Vatican has directed that ashes should be administered by sprinkling on the top of the head rather than traced on the forehead. This has long been the customary practice at the Vatican and in Italy even in ordinary times. Given the spread of the coronavirus, the practice has the advantage of not requiring the priest to touch multiple people. The invitation to "Remember that you are dust..." or "Repent and believe..." will be made to all present at once, and not repeated to each individual. No private reception of ashes

Under the direction of Bishop Boyea and the liturgical norms of the Church, ashes may not be distributed outside of communal liturgical celebrations except in extraordinary circumstances. Because of this, parish priests and staff are not able to administer ashes individually outside of the scheduled services. Please do not come to the parish hoping to receive them apart from these times.

Due to these restrictions, we will likely not be able to administer ashes to all those would otherwise wish to receive them. We ask for your understanding of these challenging times, and we trust that on Ash Wednesday God will be pleased to look at our hearts rather than our foreheads.




VIRTUAL MASS & DINNER


Come to this student intern-led mass as we pray with our interns for courage and strength as they share their faith stories with our parish community after mass!

"I Do Will it."

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said,

"If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean."

The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean. Mark 1: 40-42

In today's gospel, Jesus is "moved with pity" for the leper who approaches him in humility and trust. Jesus always wants the best for us. He stretches out his hand to us, always willing that we live healthy, whole, fulfilling lives that are aligned with God.

Fr. James Foley (writing for the St. Louis University Center for Liturgy Study) says this:

"The ancients thought that Leprosy was communicable, and at the very least disgusting. But Jesus touched him with care and said, "Be made clean." Our spiritual life consists of being "made clean," no matter how disgusting our failings may be. We must receive Jesus' touch, especially his touch upon our souls."

Today, can I feel gratitude for the many ways that Jesus is "moved with pity" for me?
