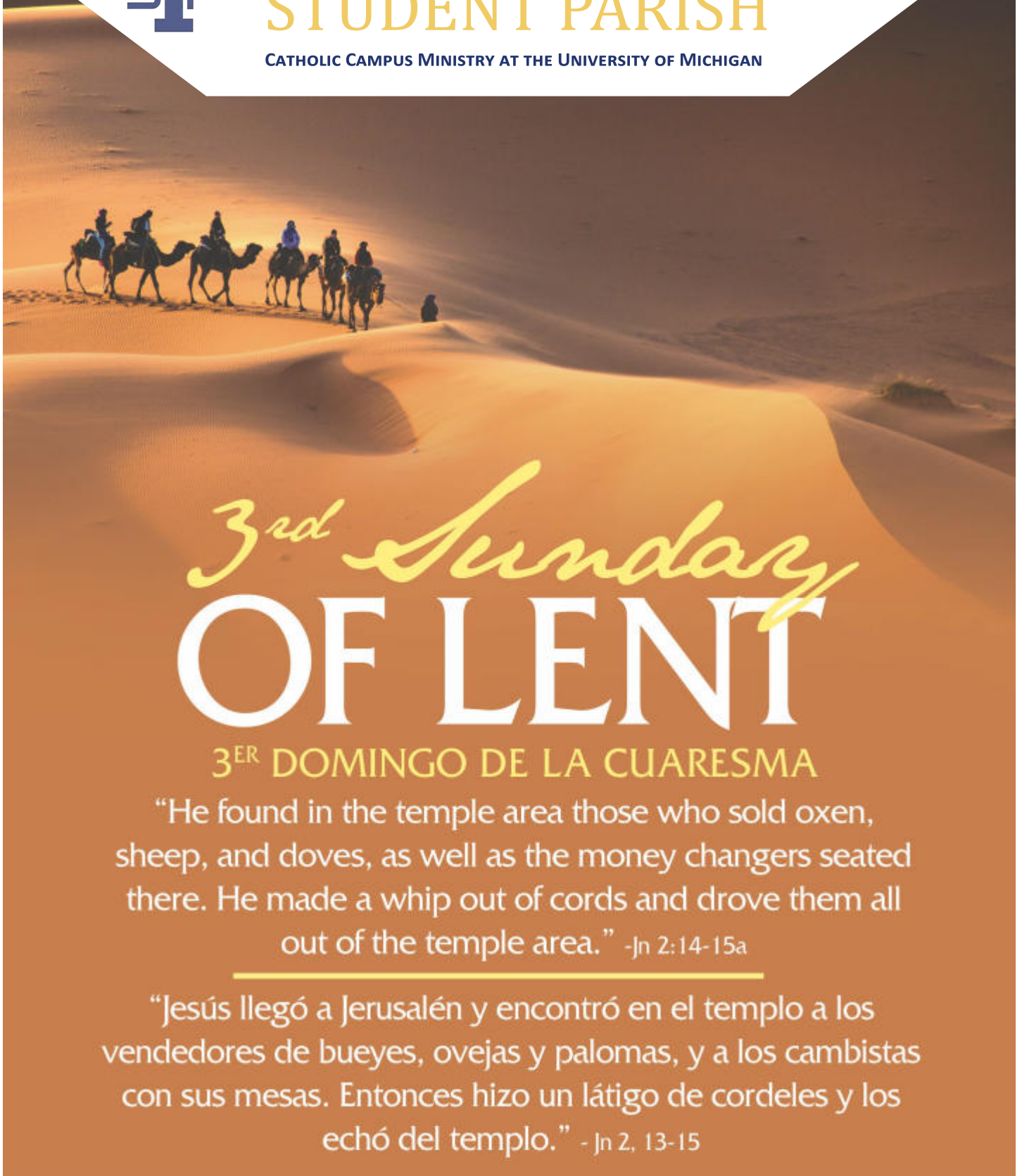

The first Sunday of my freshman year I attended mass at St. Mary's and I was welcomed into a place that would become like a second home. PARISHIONERS AND STUDENTS CAN SIT TOGETHER IN HOUSE-HOLD GROUPS WHEN ATTENDING MASS HERE. Proper social distancing is still important so we ask everyone to please follow these instructions.

- Chairs are arranged in rows of 8 on each side of the main aisle with shorter rows on the sides of the altar.
- **SEATS ARE FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE. WHEN CHOOSING YOUR SEATS THERE MUST BE 4 EMPTY SEATS BETWEEN YOU AND ANYONE ELSE IN THE SAME ROW.**
- Mass will still end with Communion. Follow the celebrant's instructions for receiving Communion.
- Masks are required to be worn during the entire Mass and must cover both your nose and mouth.
- Reservations will be limited to registered parishioners and students.
- Since we do not have pews, seating will be 60 individual chairs.
- We strongly discourage those with compromised immune systems or families with small children from attending mass.

Each year, we host two separate weeks of meals for families. This year, we have agreed to help provide meals from Monday, March 15th through Saturday, March 20th. The Saturday meal will be a brunch while the weekdays will be a dinner. Options include ordering dinner through take-out to support a local restaurant or preparing a meal from home.

Many individuals, groups and teams are taking advantage of the pandemic to bless two entities when hosting a meal for Alpha House by ordering dinner for us through take-out or delivery of a local restaurant. Many others are still planning and preparing at home. Both are welcomed! We usually feed on average 20 people. Making some meals kid-friendly is a bonus. A protein, carb, and vegetable are the main components for the meals.

If you prefer to bring your donation inside their building, we ask that you place it inside our first set of doors, in our vestibule. Staff will then retrieve your donation from there.

If you prefer contactless, please call Alpha House's front desk 734.822.0220 when you are a few minutes away from our building. The staff will put a service cart out front for you. Once you arrive, fill the cart. After you leave, the staff will retrieve your donation. Note! If you're calling and no one answers, it's likely our staff has been pulled away from the front desk attending to our families needs. Simply wait a few minutes and call back.

SCC REFLECTIONS

Lent is a good time to purify our own temple

Jesus loses his temper in today's gospel reading, chasing the money changers out of the temple area, and reminding us that our faith is about the free gift of love that comes from the Father, not how we buy it or earn it with our sacrificial gifts. He explains his actions by saying,

'I will destroy this Temple and in three days rebuild it.' (John 2:10)

"Jesus says he will destroy the most sacred symbol imaginable. So what was he doing and why? First, in showing his lordship over even this most sacred symbol, he was announcing who he was—God. Second, he was instituting a new Temple—the temple of his own body. The authentic dwelling place of God, the sanctuary that replaces the corrupt sanctuaries of religion is the temple of his crucified and risen body.

Today the Church is the sacred Temple of Christ's body. It is most itself when it gathers to pray as his body and around his body and blood. Does this mean that the Church, in its institutional dimension, is beyond criticism? Obviously not. Sometimes we need the Lord to come into the Temple and clean it out. Does it mean that, individually, we are clean and pure? No, and this Lent we might invite Jesus in for a little spring-cleaning. What in our "Temple" needs to be purified? What would arouse the anger of Jesus if he toured around inside our house?" (From Bishop Robert Barron, Wordonfire.org)

Something else to reflect on from our second reading (1 Cor 1:25)

For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Currently, baptisms are held privately due to Covid.

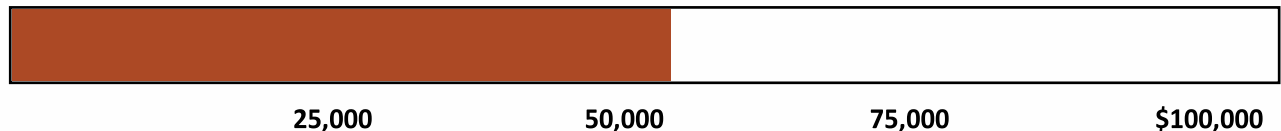

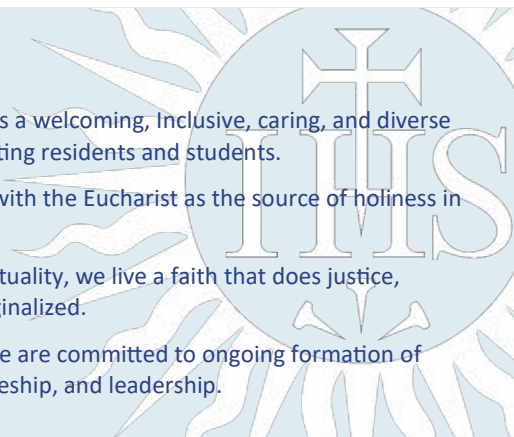
