LIVING A FAITH THAT DOES JUSTICE: REFLECTIONS ON CONVERSATIONS WITH STATE REPRESENTATIVES FOR THE DRIVE SAFE BILL

This semester, I, along with members of St. Mary's Immigration Team had the amazing opportunity to meet with our state representatives, Felicia Brabec and Yousef Rabhi, to advocate for the Drive SAFE Bill. This bill, to be reintroduced next month,

would allow undocumented people in the state of Michigan to obtain state driver's licenses. At first, this bill felt like a small thing to fight for; as a documented citizen in Michigan, having a driver's license has been the norm for myself and the people around me, and I had never thoughtfully considered the privileges I have with my state identification. I've never had to fear being pulled over and not having a state ID, and pulling out my driver's license for things like buying allergy medicine at the pharmacy is second nature.

Hearing stories from our resident parishioners about what a driver's license would mean for them made me realize that the Immigration Team's advocacy efforts is much more than helping undocumented people get another plastic card in their wallets. For our undocumented parishioners and undocumented people across Michigan, this bill alleviates the stress of detainment while on the road, it allows parents to buy medicine for their children, and it lowers costly insurance rates. These benefits are a big deal. During our meetings with the representatives, one of our team members, Nancy, shared how not having a driver's license impacts her day-to-day life:

"In our meeting with Yousef Rahbi - in which I shared my testimony - I was very nervous, but I also felt good. It encouraged me to continue doing so in order that our representatives might turn around and see us, and take into consideration our needs, fears and difficulties that we, as immigrants, experience every day because we don't have a driver's license. With support, we hope that soon, for the good of everyone, they will give us back the peace of driving safely."

Through these meetings, I've seen the light of Jesus in our Immigration Team members and I've been so inspired by the ways so many of our members at St. Mary exemplify the love of Christ through their passion for social justice. As Catholics, we are called to love our neighbors and to welcome the stranger, and I'd encourage you to learn more about the bill and ways you can help support it, as this bill would benefit members of our own community here at St. Mary. 




Is my annual DSA gift really needed?
