

LOOKING BACK ON MY LONG EXPERIMENT

On a few occasions, when talking with a student or a resident parishioner about my time here at St. Mary, they would mention to me, "I wish that you could experience St. Mary during a normal year." I heard about the usually vibrant and lively church that was now a quiet building, at best half-full. Looking back on

my long experiment here, I realize that there were so many pieces of the community that I was not able to enjoy—playing euchre in the student lounge, attending Ig.Nite masses and dinners, or celebrating the joy of Easter morning in a church packed to the rafters. Instead, masses were socially distanced, event gatherings were over Zoom, as with everywhere else.

Early on, there was a temptation to think that I was missing the real St. Mary, to wonder what my experience would have been had I not come in the midst of a pandemic. In my ministry and in my prayer, it was easy for me to confuse these surface-level things for the essential thing, that "we are Christ-centered, with the Eucharist as the source of holiness in our vibrant liturgical life," as our parish mission statement says. I only had to show up to Eucharistic adoration on a Tuesday evening or communion distribution on a Sunday morning to see how Jesus's lifegiving Spirit animates our community, even now.

I encountered that same Spirit many times over the course of the past few months, always working in new and surprising ways. In helping to coordinate the Big Read, I was amazed by people's willingness to vulnerably explore racial justice through the season of Lent. In accompanying the student interns, I was edified by their creativity and resilience in the midst of an especially difficult semester. As the Antiracism Working Group continues to grow in its mission and I hear exciting stories about what is in store for our graduating seniors, it is easy to see how the Eucharistic heart of this parish continues to fill our community with life.

It has been nothing but a gift to have participated in this, and I am grateful to have shared a bit of my time as a novice with each one of you. Thank you for your welcome, your generosity and, above all, your prayers. Next weekend I head back to the novitiate in St. Paul, MN to finish preparations to make first vows in August before heading to Fordham University to begin first studies, the next stage in Jesuit formation. Even after I move on, I would enjoy keeping touch, so please feel free to reach out. I will continue to hold all of St. Mary in prayer, that the Holy Spirit might continue to enliven our mission to become even more of a welcoming, inclusive, caring, and diverse Catholic community.

May God bless you with discomfort at easy answers, half-truths, and superficial relationships, so that you will live deep within your heart.


May God bless you with anger at injustice, oppression, and exploitation of people, so that you will work for justice, equality, and peace.

There's a Name for the Blah You're Feeling: It's Called Languishing.

LANGUISHING

The following is an excerpt from an article by Adam Grant, New York Times published on April 19, 2021 Updated April 20, 2021:

The neglected middle child of mental health can dull your motivation and focus — and it may be the dominant emotion of 2021.

At first, I didn't recognize the symptoms that we all had in

common. Friends mentioned that they were having trouble concentrating. Colleagues reported that even with vaccines on the horizon, they weren't excited about 2021. A family member was staying up late to watch "National Treasure" again even though she knows the movie by heart. And instead of bouncing out of bed at 6 a.m., I was lying there until 7, playing Words with Friends.

It wasn't burnout — we still had energy. It wasn't depression — we didn't feel hopeless. We just felt somewhat joyless and aimless. It turns out there's a name for that: languishing.

Languishing is a sense of stagnation and emptiness. It feels as if you're muddling through your days, looking at your life through a foggy windshield. And it might be the dominant emotion of 2021.

As scientists and physicians work to treat and cure the physical symptoms of long-haul Covid, many people are struggling with the emotional long-haul of the pandemic. It hit some of us unprepared as the intense fear and grief of last year faded.

Even if you're not languishing, you probably know people who are. Understanding it better can help you help them.


