## Pastoral Perspective

### BEING A MOM IS...

*“What a joy to have Mary as a mother; do not lose such sweet company, for Jesus is always with her.”*

To be a mother is to give life!

Motherhood is carrying a little angel in your womb for nine months and loving them even without knowing who they are. Your life takes a complete turn for good, because you truly start living at that moment when true love is known. The Virgin Mary agreed to carry Jesus in her womb without hesitation. Thanks to my mom, I learned what love, trust, and respect are. She is my best friend who I confide in for everything, and she does not judge me; she loves me unconditionally. I thank her for giving me the strength I didn't know I would need to become a mother.

As Rudyard Kipling puts it, “God could not be everywhere, and therefore made mothers.” He gave this great mission to the Virgin Mary because he saw in her the goodness and strength to be the mother of our Savior Jesus Christ.

It has been said that the death of a child is the most intense pain that human beings can suffer. “Death is a dreadful enemy and in one way or another it hurts all of us.” (Romans 5:12; 1 Corinthians 15:26).

God tests His best soldiers, so some moms like the Virgin Mary have suffered for their children; but without

hesitation, all moms in the world would give their lives to see their children do well. We are able to move the sky, the sea, and the earth for our children, so as to not see them suffer. We are protective moms even though our children sometimes see us as the bad guys. Someday they will understand that all we do for them is for their good.

I am a mother of two beautiful princesses: one of four years who is totally healthy, and a one-and-a-half-year-old who God chose as one of His warriors, giving our family a great mission full of pain; but we survived it thanks to faith, prayer and the family around us. Since pregnancy, she was detected with many heart problems, and doctors didn't give her hope. But as a mother I clung to her; I couldn't give up without giving that little angel a chance to fight. You can not imagine the pain, the uncertainty of not knowing what God had planned for us, yet we joined in prayer and I asked the Virgin to intercede for my girl to allow us a life next to her, and she did. She felt my pain as a mother, my desire to continue and to give love to my two daughters, so as to not give up.

Being a mother is one of the wonders that God allows us to live, a difficult path but full of light and joy. To be a mother is to know that our children look at us as their heroines, as their example to follow.

One of my favorite phrases is *“I look at my children and ask myself: Who gave life to whom?”* We carry them in the womb and give them life, but only for them to give meaning to ours!

### **BISHOP BOYEA TO LIFT DISPENSATION**

Bishop Boyea will be lifting the dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday and Holy Day Masses this Pentecost, May 22-23<sup>rd</sup>. As the Bishop writes,

The first precept of the Church is “You shall attend mass on Sunday and Holy Days of obligation and rest from servile labor” (Catechism #2042)... This is a serious responsibility on the part of the Faithful People of God “unless excused for some serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor” (Catechism #2181). Obviously, if it is impossible to fulfill this obligation, then it is not binding. When in doubt, speak with your pastor.

The Bishop also reminds us in his April 30th memo, “The dispensation remains in place, of course, for those who have serious reasons not to attend.”

As you know, we have taken the CDC recommendations and advice seriously throughout COVID and will continue to do so. One challenge we face is the smallness of our Church. In complying with the 6-foot safe distancing, our numbers are limited. We will continue to follow CDC recommendations. Depending on numbers, that might have us setting up Donnelly Hall for Masses also.

As we all know, this has been a difficult year and one of constant prayer and discernment. We long to be back together again, but we also need to be concerned about safety and the common good. Some may have serious reasons why not to begin attending Mass again. We need to trust and respect the prayer and discernment of one another. Let's continue to pray for one another, and may God continue to heal our country and our world. Prayers.

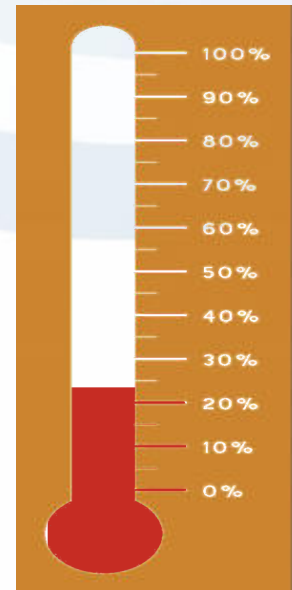

## HOW TO REPORT ABUSE

If you have been abused or victimized by someone representing the Catholic Church, we encourage you to come forward and speak out. Every diocese in the United States now has a victim assistance coordinator who is available to obtain support, to help make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese, and to arrange a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, if you desire.
