





IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Consolation is a word that Jesuits often use to describe the interior movement (or feeling) you have when you are moving closer to God. The Holy Spirit is sending inspiration and peace. Here, Jean Luc Enyegue, S.J., explains a little about conversion and consolation:

St. Ignatius showed us the consolation that grows out of the deepening faith in God. The grace we ask for in this Ignatian Year, is to "See Everything New in Christ." When we see ourselves, and the world, in this way – through the eyes of faith – we will be able to let God console us, and so embrace our present and future with renewed hope and faith.

Our conversions can take time. They grow out of self-examination and paying attention to God's word and God's active presence in our lives. It took time for Ignatius, too, but when he put God at the center of his life, he could look at the world with hope, and the desire to set it on fire with the love of Christ.

When we walk with God, there is no obstacle, no tragedy we can't overcome. Celebrating this Jubilee year reinforces our hope that things can change for the better, the joy of the Gospel can blossom. (Adapted from an article in America magazine, April 2021).

What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?



INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.


