Pastoral Perspective

SELMA ALTERNATIVE “SUMMER” BREAK EXPERIENCE

The first week of our summer break, six students and I participated in St. Mary Student Parish's Alternative “Spring” Break (ASB) program in Selma, Alabama. In Selma, our group worked with Edmundite missions for a week, serving and immersing ourselves in the community there. With Edmundite missions, we did a variety of things. Each day we helped prepare over 300 lunches and 300 dinners that we later distributed to the residents of Selma. Additionally, we spent time with kids at their after-school program working on different science projects with them and playing with them. Lastly, we aided Edmundite missions with an assortment of maintenance projects on their campus throughout the week.

I chose to go on this trip because I have learned so much about myself and about communities very different from my own on previous ASB's. Witnessing the poverty and lack of opportunity the people of Selma live in was absolutely heartbreaking and extremely challenging.

I realized how fortunate I am to have grown up in a stable family with a roof over my head and my own bed to sleep in, unlike many children in Selma. I recognized the privilege I had in attending a school district that prepares students for higher education after seeing the fragmented public school system in Selma and the lack of opportunities provided to students outside of the classroom.

In preparation for our week in Selma, our group engaged in dialogue and spent time familiarizing ourselves with the historical and present-day racial justice issues facing our country. Spending time in a majority African American community was another incredible opportunity this trip provided me. Through this immersion, I came to a greater appreciation for the ideas and perspectives that can be gained through diversity and came face to face with the injustices in our country. Every direction we turned in Selma, we could see poverty and inequity in what felt like a neglected and forgotten community. As an engineer, this was most apparent to me through the crippling infrastructure in the city. After a brief rainstorm, the streets were left flooded without proper drainage structures and pedestrian traffic in the city is problematic with few, disconnected and crumbling sidewalks.

Although life in Selma is very challenging, I was inspired by the positivity and hospitality that was provided by every person we encountered. These people, in many ways, reinforced for me what it means to be Catholic; being an instrument of hope for others and a source of love in every situation. My time in Selma has helped me see the beauty God has placed within every human and inspired me to continue seeking opportunities for service and immersion back in Michigan.

In reflection on my 4 years at the University of Michigan, participating in St. Mary's Alternative Spring Break trips have been the most impactful part of my college experience. Wrapping up our trip to Selma was a very bittersweet moment for me. Thank you to all of you who have supported St. Mary's ASB program both financially and in your prayers. This community means so much to me and I am so grateful for everything this parish has done for me.

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Message from Pope Francis for this Ignatian Year:

“Conversion is a daily matter; it is never once and for all. Ignatius’ conversion started at Pamplona, but it didn’t end there. All through his life he converted, every day again. And what does this mean? That all through his life he put Christ in the center. And he did so through discernment. Discernment is not about always getting it right from the start, but it’s rather about navigating, about having a compass to be able to set out on the road which has many twists and turns and letting oneself be guided always by the Holy Spirit who is leading us to an encounter with the Lord.

On this pilgrimage on earth, we meet others – as Ignatius did in his life. These others are signposts who help us to keep on track and who invite us to convert every time again. They are brothers [and sisters], they are situations and God speaks to us also through them. Let us listen to one another. Let us read the situations. Let us be signposts for others, showing the way to God. Conversion always happens in dialogue. With God, with the others, with the world.”

One of the greatest lies we tell ourselves is that our happiness, our joy is just around the corner, just one decision away. Everything will click into place as soon as...I get married. I get that promotion. I enter the convent. I change my diet. I...fill in the blank. The old adage reminds us that the grass actually is always greener on the other side – but that’s only if we keep looking over there, if we keep looking to what is not yet, at the expense of what is. These seemingly mundane, ordinary expressions of our desires point to our deepest longings: Of course, we want to be happy, joyful, fulfilled; but that begins by choosing to

do the hard work of practicing joy now — and recognizing the Holy Spirit at work in the immediacy of our present moment... We don’t always get it right, but we continually turn back to God; we continually choose God in our lives. We accept the necessary hardships — and our own mistakes — trusting that the Holy Spirit continues to usher us forward into a deepening relationship with God, God’s people and God’s creation.

Note:

As a parish staffed by Jesuit priests, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special “Ignatian Year.” Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after being severely wounded by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to learn more about the teachings of St. Ignatius, and to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the “shattering” changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?

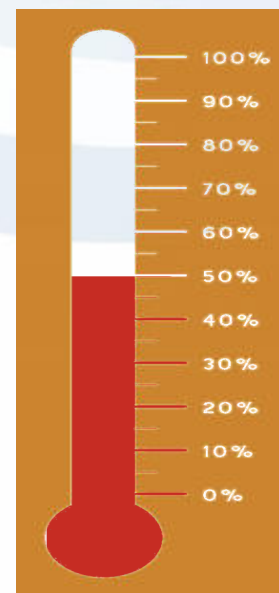

FLINT SUMMER YOUTH MISSION

The Flint Summer Youth Mission is a day camp for Flint children ages 4-13 who live on the Eastside. The camp is every Monday in July, and is structured like a Vacation Bible School - with games, crafts, and a bible story. We need many different kinds of people for a variety of roles (lead a craft, help a small group, provide security/safety, serve food, etc).

Mission days fluctuate from week to week, so it is not required to be present for all 4 Mission Days.
