ST MARY'S REOPENING PLAN AND LITURGY CHANGES

STANDING BEFORE THE PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

During the mass, standing (along with kneeling) is the primary posture when directing our prayer to God. This posture of respect and reverence in prayer has been observed by Jews and Christians for centuries. Here at St. Mary, we have somehow gotten things backwards by developing a tradition of waiting to stand until after the Prayer Over the Gifts at the offertory. In line with the Christian tradition and the general practice throughout the Church, we would like to ask the community to correct this oversight.

Just as the words “Let us pray” act as the invitation to stand for the Prayer After Communion, the words “Pray my brothers and sisters...” should serve as the invitation to stand before the Prayer Over the Gifts. Beginning this week, the presider will try to encourage all to stand as he says these words. All should be standing by the time they respond, “May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands...”

Our local tradition of waiting to stand has often been confusing to guests and newcomers who sometimes feel embarrassed when they stand as they are accustomed to, but no one else does.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

Beginning this weekend, we return to the practice of having people approach the Ministers of the Eucharist to receive Communion and then returning to their seats. In an effort to expedite the distribution of Communion, we will distribute Communion first to the front side sections, and then ask people in the main body of the church to approach beginning with the front row of seats, and moving toward the back. Eucharistic ministers will be present in the back of the Church to distribute Communion to those in the balcony (choir loft).

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Drawing close to God

"But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." (Mt 6:5)

The heart of Ignatian Spirituality (and life as a Christian in general), is rooted in prayer. St. Ignatius taught that God pursues us in the routines of our everyday life, and in the hopes and fears of life's challenges. That's right – God pursues US. We just have to pay attention and respond, and prayer helps us do that.

Kathy England, Pastoral Associate at St. Xavier Church in Cincinnati, reminds us that "we do not need to live in church, or be involved in every ministry at our parish in order to give glory to our God."

It's during those times when we remember to be aware of God's presence in our daily lives, and feel God gazing at us with love, that we are able to draw especially close, and "receive God's grace tenfold." Grace, peace and fulfillment, perhaps that's what Jesus means when he speaks of "repayment" in Matthew's Gospel (above).

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

BAPTISM CLASS

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism. Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM.

Class dates through 2021 are as follows (subject to change): 7/12, 8/2, 9/12, 10/4, 11/1 and 12/6.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

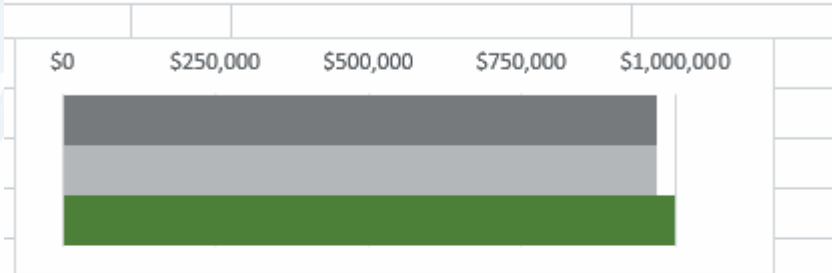

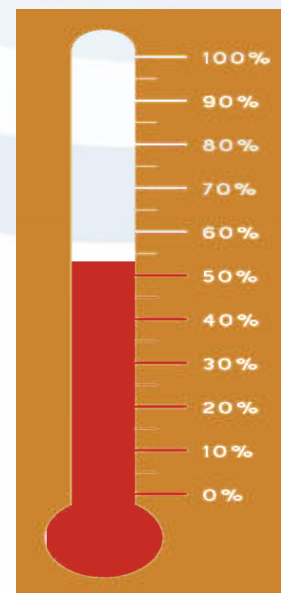

HOW TO REPORT ABUSE

If you have been abused or victimized by someone representing the Catholic Church, we encourage you to come forward and speak out. Every diocese in the United States now has a victim assistance coordinator who is available to obtain support, to help make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese, and to arrange a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, if you desire.
