The global Ignatian community is celebrating the Ignatian Year, honoring 500 years since St. Ignatius' conversion in 1521.

Here are some ways we are honoring the Ignatian Year at SMSP:

## IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

### 'The Gentle Saint'

Earlier this month, we celebrated the feast day of St. Peter Faber, a good friend of St. Ignatius, and a co-founder of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). Writers have long noted the qualities of Peter, also known by his French name of Pierre Favre. He is a saint whose counsel and wisdom are so needed in our turbulent times.

His 150 letters are "marked with a sense of tenderness," says author Shemaiah Gonzalez, who calls him "the gentle saint." Faber's friendships and conversations "were not self-centered, but sought the good of the other," she said.

"During the Reformation, Faber worked with Protestants, seeking to understand and foster unity. His work was diplomatic, marked by openness and charity. 'Take care, take care, never to close your heart to anyone,' he said. I long for this model of kindness, open to dialogue and unity in a world that is so divided."

**Note:** As a parish staffed by Jesuit priests, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special "Ignatian Year." Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to learn more about the teachings of St. Ignatius, and to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?

Faber's humility and desire to bring glory to God ring through his tender prayer:

*I beg of you, my Lord, to remove anything that separates me from you, and you from me.  
Remove anything that makes me unworthy of your sight, your control, your reprehension; of your speech and conversation, of your benevolence and love.*

*Take from me every evil  
that stands in the way of my seeing you,  
hearing, tasting, savoring, and touching you;  
fearing and being mindful of you;  
knowing, trusting, loving, and possessing you;  
being conscious of your presence  
and, as far as may be, enjoying you.  
This is what I ask for myself and earnestly desire from you.  
Amen.*

## INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

**BAPTISM PREPARATION CLASS** is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism. Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM on the following dates. **9/12, 10/4, 11/1 AND 12/6.**

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

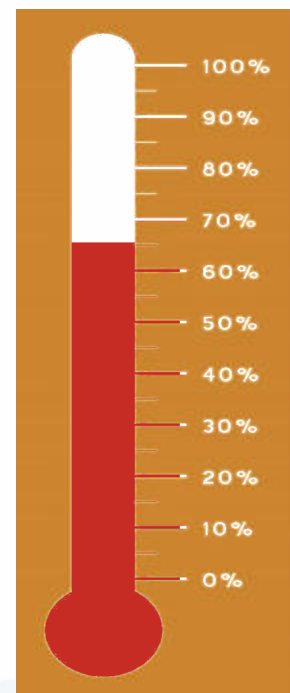
