Ignatian Year at SMSP



IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

People talk about fresh starts, and September certainly brings that for many of us. It's a new season, and the beginning of a new academic life for many students. It can be a challenge for us, as we hesitate to let go of the things that are familiar and comfortable.

St. Ignatius understood our human tendency to want to hold too tightly to the past, or even to our own plans and ideas we may have for our future. He would ask us to remain open to what God wants to send us, and to put God first.

Other spiritual scholars have written about this too. Henri Nouwen often spoke of receiving God's gifts "with open hands," reminding us that if we go about life with our hands clenched and closed, we won't be able to receive something new and unexpected. A couple of points from Ignatian teaching might be helpful at this time of year:

• All things are gifts from God. They are given to us to know God better and love God more fully. Our invitation is to grow our awareness of God's abundant gifts.

• As we name the gifts, we are to hold all the gifts and desires of our heart in balance, centered securely around God, the Giver of the gifts. No gift is to displace the Giver of the gift.

In case you have not heard, last Sunday (August 29), there was a meeting hosted by the Realign Resources for Mission Committee providing videos of the work that has been done by the Committee over the past 2 years. This committee will be recommending to the Bishop at the beginning of October that a new structure/model be put in place to lead to healthy parishes. In short, the recommendation will include that the 70 parishes in the Diocese be grouped together (based on a variety of considerations) into smaller groups (of 2 to 5 parishes) so that priests and staff could work together and share resources across the parish grouping.

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism.
