

## Ignatian Year at SMSP



#### IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS Friendship, Obedience & Mission by Fr. Mark Mossa, S.J.

Have you ever wondered what Jesus meant when he said, "You are my friends if you do what I command"? (John 15:14) Certainly most of us would be put off if anyone other than Jesus were to say that to us! Yet, most of us to some degree would understand our relationship to Jesus in this way. We want to do what he commands! And, if you think about it, while we might call it "advice" rather than a "command," often enough we choose to do things because we have been encouraged to do so by those who know us most intimately. Obedience needn't be seen in a negative light.

I think that the journey of Ignatius "the pilgrim," as he called himself during his conversion experience, offers us an interesting window into the import of Jesus' words. His conversion did not take place in isolation, but rather was a journey of many friendships. He spent much of his time getting to know people, and sharing the spiritual insights that he was learning along the way (this would eventually become the substance of his Spiritual Exercises). During these conversations, he would sometimes give people suggestions as to how to proceed in their spiritual lives. And when they followed his advice, it sometimes got him in trouble! In one instance, two prominent women were inspired by him to make a pilgrimage. Thinking that he had somehow led them astray, he was imprisoned until they returned and confirmed his account of things-that they had gone of their own accord. You could say in a way, however, that their lives had been improved by being "obedient" to Ignatius.

This relationship between friendship and obedience would take center stage when it came to the establishment of the Jesuit order. By then, the pilgrim had settled into life as a student at the University of Paris. There he formed deep friendships with a group of fellow students who would share with each other the now more comprehensive and structured experience of The Spiritual Exercises. Through this experience, each was inspired to offer their lives in service to Jesus, but they weren't sure exactly what form this would take for each of them. What they did know is that they wanted to remain friends. In the context of their time (the 16<sup>th</sup> century) and their religious commitment, they determined that the best way to ensure their union of minds and hearts would be to form a religious community, and vow obedience to one of their own number.

Thus, "the Society of Jesus" was born, not the vision of one man, but rather a group of friends. And, though they did indeed take a vow of obedience to Ignatius, they all understood that this obedience was at the service of their friendship, and not the condition for it, and that it was but a human representation of their desire to follow the will of God for their lives and for their mission to serve the people of God. Choosing "obedience" to our friends in the Lord seems a lot less strange when we, like the disciples, and like those first Jesuits, do so in the service of the mission that God has given us as a community of faith. It can serve as a more concrete way that we seek and find the will of God. It's no coincidence that this is also the goal of the *Spiritual Exercises*.

**Note:** As a Jesuit parish, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special "Ignatian Year." Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?




