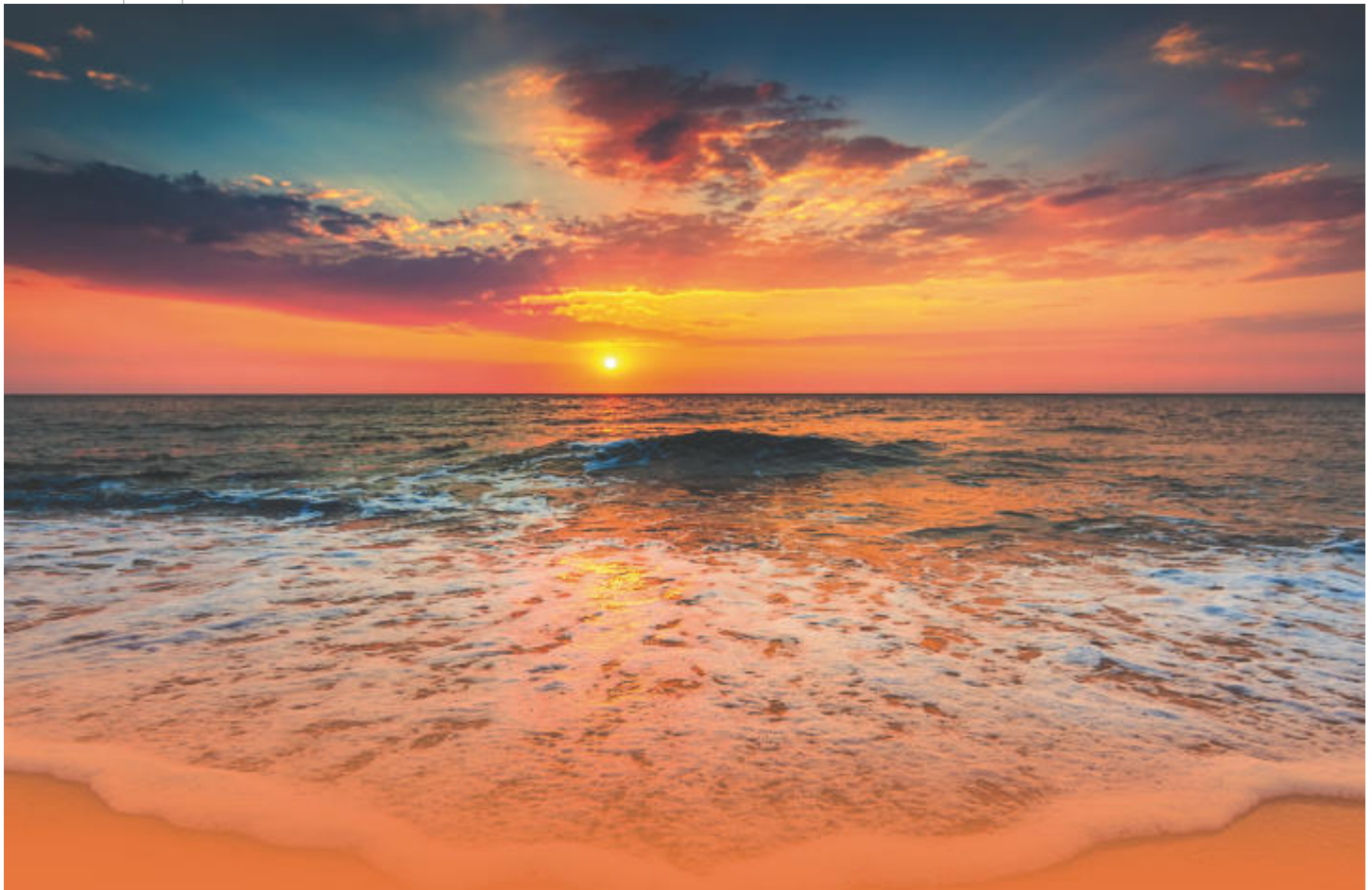

Good Humor: Tenderness & Ted Lasso

I watched part of the Emmys a couple of weeks ago, and I was struck by the fact that, as with the Golden Globes, a show called “The Flight Attendant” was being nominated in the comedy category. If you have seen the show, you might, as I was, be surprised by this. For despite starring one of the lead actresses of the very funny “Big Bang Theory,” it is a serious, and rather dark, drama. I would never recommend it to someone in need of a good laugh.

It got me wondering. Is this because comedy is in short supply these days? Sure, we can point to people like Stephen Colbert, Jimmy Fallon, Seth Myers, Jimmy Kimmel, or the cast of SNL and say, “they’re funny.” Yet, if you’re looking for an escape from the most disturbing and serious issues of our day, you won’t find it with them, because that is often what their humor is focused on. And, depending upon whether or not you agree with them politically, you also run the risk of finding yourself the butt of the joke! It feels almost as if we are suffering from an epidemic of seriousness. What most of us need today is a really good laugh, and I’m not sure many of us are getting it. I worry that my own experience of things that are “laugh-out-loud” funny have become fewer and far between. This is troubling because without opportunities to laugh, we risk being beaten down and crushed by the serious.

The other thing that happened at the Emmys is that the comedy “Ted Lasso” won 7 awards (after receiving 20 nominations), offering a glimmer of hope in this suddenly overly serious world of ours. I am grateful for Ted Lasso because it does offer me that opportunity to laugh out loud, even when I’m watching it alone, and better if I’m watching it with others. I’m grateful for Ted Lasso because it offers the hope that humor, even our sometimes weak attempts at humor, can make life better, especially if combined with kindness, which is really what Ted Lasso is all about. As the character Ted Lasso manages to win people over no matter how hard they try to dislike him, so the show somehow helps us overcome our cynicism, and begin to believe that someone like Ted Lasso can not only exist in this world, but make it better.

There are lots of voices out there—and unfortunately many in our own church—that alternatively portray kindness as weakness, that prefer rage and insult to civil discourse, that think lying and deception are OK in pursuit of their “worthy” cause, that would rather tear someone down than make the effort to get to know them. And don’t make the mistake of thinking that this is unique to those on any one side of the fence. How many people, known only to you from news or social media, do you dismiss or even hate without really knowing their heart. How many people are there out there like Cindy McCain, who will speak badly of neither Joe Biden nor Lindsey Graham, because she knows each man more intimately than any of us do?

It’s no wonder that Pope Francis is calling for a “revolution of tenderness.” In a world of tenderness, we can laugh *with* others and not cruelly at their expense, and kindness can become our default. I remember a Star Trek episode in which crew members began to go mad, because they were unable to dream. I think we face a similar fate if we are unable to laugh. Hopefully Ted Lasso’s success will inspire a generation to realize that humor and kindness are not mutually exclusive, and that we can love and laugh together, no matter our differences. This might seem like a tall order these days. But maybe Pope Francis, and Ted Lasso, are offering us a place to start.

Ignatian Year at SMSP



In the Spirit of Ignatius

What astonished me today?

In Today's Gospel reading (Mk 10: 2-16) we see Jesus bringing a child into the middle of the "grownups" to remind them how much he loves the lowly and the meek. We get the sense that Jesus especially loves the way children react to their surroundings. If we want to partake of the Kingdom of God, he says, we must show the same humility – the same wonder and childlike openness.

St. Ignatius took that message to heart. In his prayer suggestions and his writings, Ignatius urges us to pay attention. He wants us to take time each day, to really notice how busy God is in our daily lives, and to respond to all this with wonder and awe, like a child who is presented with some new discovery.

But what gets in the way of our childlike faith? Perhaps it's our own egos, or the things of the world that we might cling to (what Ignatius calls a disordered attachment). He reminds us to let go of these obstacles, so we can be more receptive to what God wants to send us. If we are free and open – really taking notice of the many gifts we can discover each day – we will want to respond in love to God, and to others.

As Pope Francis puts it, *"To enter into the Kingdom of Heaven we must allow ourselves to be astonished."*

Prayer:

Lord God, Teach me to approach life's experiences and encounters with a childlike wonder and expectation. Free me from anything that prevents me from living each moment as if it contains endless possibility. Amen (Fr. Russell Pollitt, S.J.)

Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?

Roundup from the Anti-Racism Working Group (ARWG)

St. Mary Student Parish is committed to raising awareness about racial injustice, and working toward dismantling racist systems and policies. The parish has an Anti-Racism Working Group that is part of the Faith Doing Justice Ministry. Here's a roundup of what the group has been working on:

Our group continues to meet every other week [in spirit of our vision](#). This spring and summer, our actions included our Pope Francis banner throughout Lent, and The Big Read of James Cone's The Cross and the Lynching Tree.

We develop opportunities to unpack the privileges and prejudices we each carry inside us. Exclusion of any kind is not of Christ. Racism makes every form of exclusion worse and prevents us from creating the Beloved Community that Christ wishes for all of us. As a result, our efforts through ARWG are to help us do the interior work to see with Christ's eyes and not those of our respective social privileges. We are sponsoring a Small Church Community (SCC) using the [JustFaith](#) Racial Justice curriculum. Presented through the lens of the Christian tradition, JustFaith Ministries' *Faith & Racial Equity: Exploring Power & Privilege* is a nine-session program that awakens individuals and groups to racial injustices within our systems and structures. Participants meet via Zoom for 90 minutes a week and commit to 1-2 hours of reading, watching videos, and reflecting between sessions. We hope to offer this program again in the Winter. Ruby Pérez, our Faith Doing Justice intern this year, is hosting an SCC for students at all levels who identify as BIPOC -- to reflect on God's presence and activity in our lives, and grow in faith and fellowship. Monday, October 4th at 7 p.m. in Newman Hall, we will view TONI MORRISON: THE PIECES I AM with a discussion led by Fr. Mark Mossa, SJ. She is noted for her writing style, which creatively wove multiple narratives, perspectives, and dialects into one story. 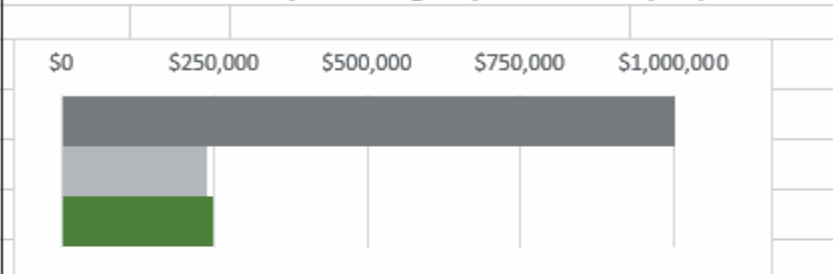
