## Pastoral Perspective

### CAN WE BE A HUMBLE SERVANT OF JESUS?

In today's Gospel we hear about James and John wanting a special place in heaven with Jesus and both totally not understanding what they are asking for, or what it would mean to achieve their request.

You might recall in Mark 1: 10 and 20 they were the two mending nets in their fishing boat with their father and other workers. When Jesus called them they left their father and other workers immediately to follow Jesus. Jesus explained to them what it would mean to fill their request. To make matters worse the other disciples were upset and jealous and needless to say it looked like there was an ego problem among them. Jesus has to go inform them what it means to be a disciple of his. *"Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant: who ever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all."*

Now what does all this look like in our everyday life and how can we respond to this Gospel to be a humble servant of Jesus?

LET ME TELL YOU A STORY...

A long time ago I was a police officer in Philadelphia and was assigned to a burglary investigation in center city Philadelphia. I went to the district where the burglary originated. While there I went out to get some lunch. I found a place that had room (since downtown is very crowded at noon) and was sitting next to a window. I was waiting for my food and about 20 feet away was a

dumpster and there was a man who appeared homeless going through the dumpster looking for food.

There were others in the restaurant who saw this also. I was moved to go out and give him money to buy lunch but hesitated as a thought went through my mind (what would people think of me as no one else was moved to do anything.) With that, I overcame my fear of what people might think and gave him enough money to buy a good lunch.

Sisters and brothers, one of the weapons the evil one tries to use to keep us from being true disciples is fear.

## INTERNATIONAL SAMARITAN 5K

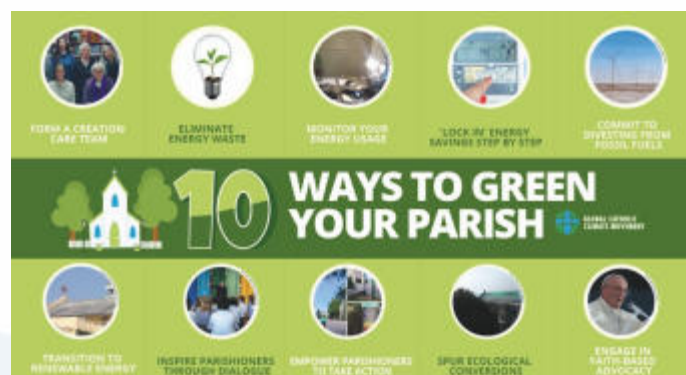

## Ignatian Year at SMSP



### IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

#### Making some choices in life? Stay open and “detached”

As we begin to return to a life that seems more normal after COVID restrictions, we may find we are faced with some big decisions. Many people have changed jobs, or decided to make lifestyle changes. Our students, as always, find themselves praying and thinking about the next steps after graduation.

St. Ignatius developed some guidelines for helping people to make good choices, or discernment, as he called it. He expected that discernment would take some work, including prayer and a thoughtful sense of knowing yourself.

Here are a couple of other guidelines from the authors at [Ignatianspirituality.com](http://Ignatianspirituality.com).

“The Ignatian approach to good choices rests on several presuppositions. First it assumes that the alternatives being considered are all positive, constructive, and morally correct. The person making the decision is someone who is spiritually maturing and who wants to make the choice that will lead to a deeper relationship with God.

The Ignatian approach to good choices emphasizes freedom. Making a free decision means that we set aside our own preferences and preconceptions and strive to be free of social pressures and psychological strains. We carefully examine our motives and desires. This isn't easy. Much of the prayer and reflection in Ignatian decision making has to do with achieving the detachment necessary to choose freely.”

Something to note: The Ignatian word, “detachment,” is about holding all things in balance – it's about not hanging onto one particular idea, or preference too tightly. We must have the freedom to be open to what God wants to send us. As we weigh our options, we can *“gather all the relevant information about our alternatives and carefully weigh all the circumstances and likely outcomes.”* However, it's a good idea to pay attention to our feelings and desires, too.

Decision making in the Ignatian mode involved both the heart and the mind.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

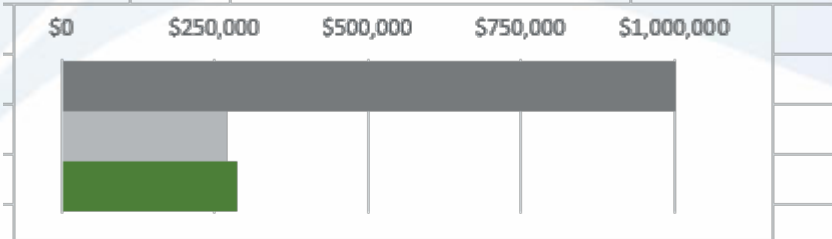
