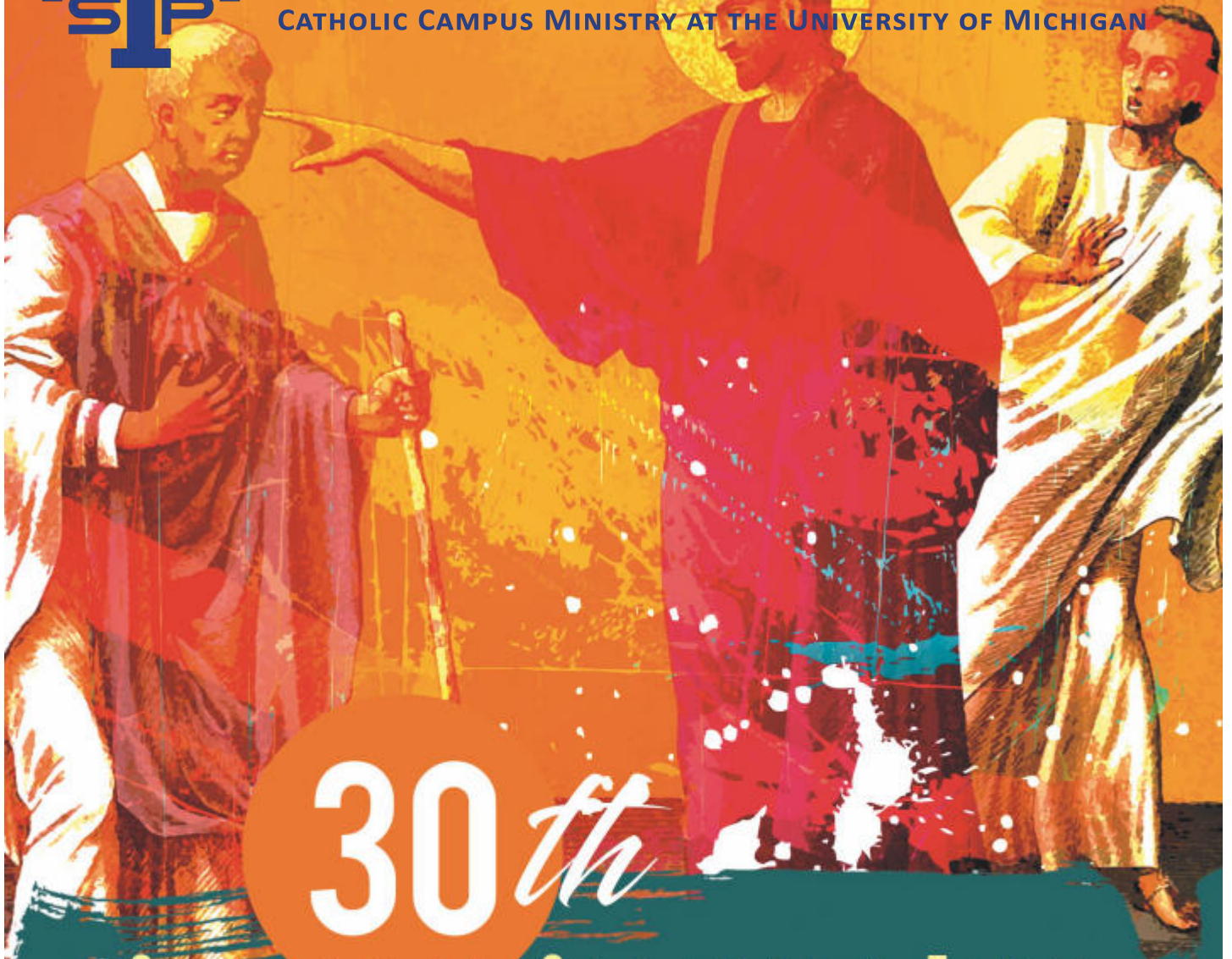

Pastoral Perspective

HOW TO SUPPORT AND UNDERSTAND THE PRIESTS HERE

In today's second reading from Hebrews the writer instructs us how to approach and understand the priests who serve God on behalf of the people. We hear about how Christ himself the

eternal high priest was called from God the father:

You are my son and this day I have begotten you....you are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

Today's reading inspired me to think about our own priests here at St. Mary Student Parish. We are so very blessed to have these wonderful priests who heard and answered a call to the priesthood from God the father. Their discernment led them to be formed in Jesuit spirituality, grounded in love for Christ and drawing from the rich tradition of Ignatian Spirituality. The mission to "Seek God in All Things" is how they serve us, lead us, and guide us in our own relationship with God. Growing in our relationship with God will then naturally lead us to look outward to others, to bring our spirituality into the world by sharing what we have with others.

I appreciate all the gifts they bring to all of us from their own life experiences. I know that each time I have asked for something from one of them, they have warmly and generously responded. With that in mind I'd like to suggest some ways that we can all support these special men that God has placed in our lives:

- ✚ Have realistic expectations. While offering feedback can be helpful, criticism and complaints without humility can be draining.
- ✚ Say thank you, and compliment constructively. I've heard that priests appreciate simple words such as "that was such a beautiful mass, Father".

- ✚ Avoid and discourage gossip about priests and parishes.
- ✚ If they have made a difference in your life, let them know. Write them a note expressing gratitude.
- ✚ Volunteer your time to the parish. Get involved. There are endless opportunities and ways to give our time and talents within the parish and to our local community.
- ✚ Pray for vocations.
- ✚ Most importantly, pray for them – a holy hour, a rosary, or offer up a daily suffering. Let them know that you prayed for their intentions.

Here is a prayer for priests, and future priests from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

*O God, Father of all Mercies, Provider of a bountiful Harvest,
Send Your Graces upon those You have called to gather the fruits of Your labor; preserve and strengthen them in their lifelong service of you.*

Open the hearts of Your children that they may discern Your Holy Will; inspire in them a love and desire to surrender themselves to serving others in the name of Your son, Jesus Christ.

Teach all your faithful to follow their respective paths in life guided by Your Divine Word and Truth.

Through the intercession of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, all the Angels, and Saints, humbly hear our prayers and grant Your Church's needs, through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Ignatian Year at SMSP



IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Ask for what you want

Jesus asked the blind beggar in today's gospel (Mk 10:46-52) "what do you want me to do for you?" It seemed like answering the question was required before the miracle could take place. Jesus wants us to come to him and ask for what we desire – what will bring us lasting peace and joy.

St. Ignatius loved this idea of knowing our "desires," and the importance of discovering what we are meant to do in life. Bringing our deepest feelings and desires to God shows that we have a loving, trusting friendship with God.

For Ignatius, the ideal prayer also requires us to recognize our complete need for God. In the daily Examen prayer, we take the time to reflect on our day, and to bring to God those areas of our lives that are most in need of healing. Like the blind beggar in today's Gospel, Jesus wants us to name what we want and what we need.

"We prefer to imagine ourselves as independent and self-reliant, with no need of help from God. But the acknowledgement of our need is an essential condition of the Lord's action," says Jesuit writer Richard Hauser, S.J. "St. Paul was painfully aware of ... his need for help. So also were the blind, the deaf, the diseased and the infirm in the Gospel.

Acknowledging need is never demeaning for the disciple of Christ; rather it is a privileged occasion for experiencing his love." -

(Finding God in Troubled Times, Loyola Press, 2002)

Ignatius also had this suggestion: Ask for a particular grace that you'd like to see happen in your prayer session. Ask for the grace to want to do something, such as to be more open in receiving what God wants to send me, or perhaps to be better able to be still and not be distracted. And if you find it hard to desire something (such as being more forgiving), Ignatius advises this – "Ask for the desire to desire it."

Prayer suggestion:

O Lord my God, teach my heart this day where and how to see you; where and how to find you... Let me find you by loving you, let me love you when I find you.

– St. Anselm

Note: As a Jesuit parish, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special "Ignatian Year." Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?

Through student talks, small groups, and time for personal prayer and reflection, we will reflect on our own experiences asking God to help us to see all things new in Christ.

Mercy House is a homeless hospitality house located in downtown Ann Arbor. It provides services to the homeless population of Ann Arbor including meals, clothing, laundry, showers, etc. Our volunteers primarily help run the Saturday breakfast operation. As a volunteer, you will be helping prepare food, package it, and deliver it to those in need. We are sometimes asked to do other tasks around the house, such as organizing donations, picking up trash, doing dishes, etc.

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism.

Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM on the following dates. **11/1 and 12/6**. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.
