THE PRACTICE OF PURE AND RIGHT INTENTION

St. Ignatius recommended a few means to become spiritually focused, interiorly free, and united with God. One of these means is what he refers to as pure and right intention. In one place Ignatius states that "all should make diligent efforts to keep their intention right, not only regarding their state of life but also in all particular details."

In another he advocates that all ought to have "an intention completely right, pure, and unmixed, without any mingling of vanity or stain of self-will and self-interest." And lastly, pure and right intention also shows up in his well-known Spiritual Exercises when he states that "all my intentions, actions, operations may be ordered purely to the service and praise of the Divine Majesty." For Ignatius, this practice is at the heart of making progress spiritually.

This prayerful habit of pure intention is not a matter of always consciously thing of God every second of the day or during each activity—a schizophrenia of sorts—but it's an intentionality, as commonplace and simple as saying once or more throughout our day , *Lord, may all the human effort and activity of my day be for love and praise of you*. It is keeping one's focus, motive, and desire not upon self-gain, self-importance, self-will, self-aggrandizement, or self-praise, but always upon the ultimate end of all creation—namely, the greater honor, praise, love, and glory of God. In the midst of every daily effort, Ignatius was a man riveted upon the finality of life—to give praise and glory to God in all things. That was his deepest-down desire and motivation: AMDG.

So, following his lead, each day we also can <u>intend</u> to give praise and glory to God in all things: in our rising, our getting kids off to school, our daily house chores, our efforts in nurturing friendships, our sacrifices for family betterment, our endurance when facing a trial or feeling alone, the challenges and joys of marital love, our cooking, our listening to our children, our patience with misfortunes, our prayer and moments of surrendering to life's uncertainties, our buying of groceries and managing other errands, our attentiveness to relatives who are in need, our fatigue and sleeping and , lest it be overlooked, our endeavors for our Church. It's a practice that prompts a single-mindedness and a spiritual orientation of our soul.

The practice of pure intention matches up well with living the simple gospel exhortation, "seek <u>first</u> the kingdom of God." It matches up well with the "hallowed be <u>thy</u> name" of the Lord's Prayer, and also the doxology of our Eucharistic liturgy, "through him, and with him, and in him...all glory and honor is <u>yours</u>." Indeed, a pure intention, one not "mixed with human motives," is not some unhealthy mind game, but an intentionality and singleness of soul for daily life and daily efforts—fundamentally, a gift of heart and mind, honed within us by the Holy Spirit. When our intention is effectively a self-forgetfulness of our own shortsighted disordered will and, rather, an alignment with God's ways, we are surely pleased and united with the Lord. To that extent, we give glory to God all day long in all things! Onward!!



IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Note: For our Advent and Christmas bulletins, we will let the words of Pope Francis lead us in prayerful contemplation of the birth of our Savior. Francis, the first Jesuit pope, brings a unique *Ignatian approach* to his letters and teachings. One of his favorite themes is the message of God's never ending love for us, which you see echoed here in his Christmas Eve homily from 2020:

"The birth of Christ is a gift from God that brings people hope and courage in troubled times. Underlying all our strengths and weaknesses, stronger than all our past hurts and failures or our fears and concerns about the future, there is this great truth. We are beloved sons and daughters. God's love for us does not, and never will, depend upon us. It is completely free love, pure grace ..."

"God came into the world as a child to make us children of God," the pope said. "What a magnificent gift! This day, God amazes us and says to each of us: 'You are amazing."

Pope Francis questioned why the "greatest of kings" was born in a dark and lowly stable, in poverty and rejection. "God loves to work wonders through our poverty and placed the whole of our salvation in the manger of a stable ... The Son of God was born an outcast, in order to tell us that every outcast is a child of God."

The pope also reflected that "Bethlehem" — which means "house of bread" in Hebrew — is a reminder of humanity's need for God "like the bread we eat. How often, in our hunger for entertainment, success and worldly pleasures, do we nourish life with food that does not satisfy and leaves us empty within! It is true; in our endless desire for possessions, we run after any number of mangers filled with ephemeral things, and forget the manger of Bethlehem."

"That manger, poor in everything yet rich in love, teaches that true nourishment in life comes from letting ourselves be loved by God and loving others in turn

ONLINE GIVING NEWS

In April 2020, we added a new online giving platform – "Parishsoft Online Giving". We have received positive feedback on how user friendly it is. We would like to move all online giving over to this platform and discontinue using the legacy system by December 31, 2021. This will reduce the cost of maintaining two systems.

Parishsoft is offering a Donor Match Program for all givers who add new recurring donations from Nov 1 thru-Dec 31. For every new recurring donation that is added in that time period, Parishsoft will match the donation, up to \$50, with a maximum match of \$1,000 per organization. Below are the simple steps to transition to this exciting new way to give!

FIRST TIME—To donate for the first time on the Parishsoft Online Giving platform

Step 1: Click <u>HERE</u> to set up your donation or copy and paste this into your browser

Step 2: Select one time or recurring donation

Step 3: Continue to complete the data fields as requested and then click the blue Submit button

Step 4: If you have been giving on the legacy system, you will want to cancel your recurring donation on that system by logging into your account <u>HERE</u> or copy and paste this into your browser:
