IN WHAT WAYS DO WE NEED TO RECEIVE GOD'S LOVE THIS YEAR?

This year was my son's first Christmas. It was exciting, new, and a joy to watch him. However, it was even more of a joy watching family members snuggle him, cuddle him, and hold him. Whenever he would come into a room, everyone would

turn and focus on him. They would also make some really funny faces and sounds to make him smile!

I am beginning to see why God decided to enter the world as a child. God wanted the world to receive Him with love and be received in His love. The mystery of the Incarnation invites us all to consider how God sent His only son for each of us. In what ways do we need to receive God's love this year? In what areas of our life do we need God to help us stretch out our arms to receive and hold the greatest gift in the person of Christ?

As students return to campus, let us continue to pray for them that they might receive God's love through our community. I pray that we all can turn our attention to Jesus and help students grow in their faith this semester. Despite all the challenges, let us continue to persevere in love and be a light to others this year.

I want to end with a reflection from Pope Francis this past Christmas Eve:

"Brothers and sisters, standing before the crib, we contemplate what is central...we contemplate the child. In his littleness, God is completely present. Let us acknowledge this: "Baby Jesus, you are God, the God who becomes a child". Let us be amazed by this scandalous

truth. The One who embraces the universe needs to be held in another's arms. The One who created the sun needs to be warmed. Tenderness incarnate needs to be coddled. Infinite love has a miniscule heart that beats softly. The eternal Word is an "infant", a speechless child. The Bread of life needs to be nourished. The Creator of the world has no home...Let us ask ourselves: can we accept God's way of doing things? This is the challenge of Christmas: God reveals himself, but men and women fail to understand. He makes himself little in the eyes of the world, while we continue to seek grandeur in the eyes of the world, perhaps even in his name. God lowers himself and we try to become great. The Most High goes in search of shepherds, the unseen in our midst, and we look for visibility, to be seen. Jesus is born in order to serve, and we spend a lifetime pursuing success. God does not seek power and might; he asks for tender love and interior littleness."

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Tips for praying more in 2022

This time of year, people often set a goal to pray more. Like all resolutions, however, this too can get set aside as our busy lives take over. Fr. James Martin, S.J. (author of *Learning to Pray, A Guide for Everyone,* Harper Collins) has a few tips for spending more time in prayer this year.

Set modest goals (maybe 15 to 30 minutes a day) and take it easy at first. This way you won't be discouraged if you can't meet your loftier goals. Typically people feel more relaxed about a shorter time period, then end up praying longer than they'd planned.

Mix it up. We can easily get stuck in a rut. Try various forms of prayer, including imaginative prayer, praying with scripture, art or music, or maybe journaling or just writing down key words or ideas that come up during prayer. Here's a website that may help: https://

Let it go if it's not working. Prayer shouldn't feel like a burden. Perhaps, if you are ending up with a long list of people to pray for, you could pray for them in one common intention, or half the list on certain days. If you have decided to read an entire Gospel, try to focus more narrowly on one of the daily scripture readings.

Above all, trust in God, Fr. Martin says.

"Often, we are tempted to think the results are up to us... But it is God who invites us to pray, God who helps us to pray and God who gives us the fruits of prayer. It is not you just white-knuckling it and gritting your teeth. God is on your side. In fact, the very desire to pray more is coming from God. So see this desire, and your resolution, as a call. And trust that God will be with you and will help you."

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism.

Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM on the following dates. **1/10, 2/7, 3/7, 4/4, 5/2 AND 6/6.** If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.
