WORKING TOWARD A TRUE SPIRIT OF WELCOME AND INCLUSION

As followers of Christ, we talk about the need to work for justice, and to welcome all with love. So how are we actually doing with that?

As a parish, do we welcome everyone, as God intended? Do we actively work to challenge and dismantle the patterns of prejudice and

discrimination in our community? Here at St. Mary Student Parish, we are trying to listen and learn from one another in an effort to create the beloved community that Jesus imagined – a vision founded on the inherent dignity and worth of every person.

With this in mind, our parish's Anti-Racism Working Group has planned an upcoming event to honor Martin Luther King Day, and to help us all move closer toward these goals together. Please join us for a talk by the dynamic musician and speaker John Thorne, who has worked to promote racial justice in the Detroit area for many years.

His goal in speaking, he said, "is to help us frame racism both in a historical context as well as a present-day context in relation to recent events in our country, as well as the Black Lives Matter Movement."

"I want to present us with steps that will lead us to making the Church a place of welcome for all, as it was always intended to be," he said.

We are very excited to host Mr. Thorne, who serves as the Executive Director of the Detroit Catholic Pastoral Alliance, and is the former director of the Office of Black Catholic Ministries in the Archdiocese of Detroit, a role he held for six years.

Here's a little more about John Thorne:

- A resident of Detroit, he also teaches theology at the University of Detroit Jesuit High School and Academy.
- He is the Pastoral Associate and minister of music at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Detroit.
- He has been a presenter (for 5 years) for the United States
 Conference of Catholic Bishops on the topic of Building
 Intercultural Competencies.

He also created a mobile Black Lives Matter Memorial, which has been installed in area homes, churches and businesses.

Mr. Thorne will speak at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 23 in Donnelly Hall here at St. Mary. His talk is called: "All Are Welcome...But Are they? Making the Church a place of Welcome in the Midst of an Unwelcoming World"

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

'Ask God to go with you'

Jesuit priests and teachers often talk about the need to have a friendship with God. For some of us, it may seem like a new, or strange idea, but St. Ignatius suggested this in his writings from the 1500s.

Our faith, St. Ignatius taught, will change and deepen when we understand that God wants to relate to us as a close friend. God is not distant from us, but always active and present in our lives, even when we push God away.

Even in Old Testament scripture, we see passages where God regards his chosen people as the "apple of God's eye," writes Fr. William Barry, S.J. in his book, "A Friendship Like No Other," (Loyola Press). God never gives up on the Israelites, he says, even when they whine and complain and say they want to go back to Egypt, where they were enslaved.

"Only true friendship, a genuine liking, can explain such crazy fidelity," Fr. Barry says.

His book also provides some wonderful reflections and ideas for praying with scripture. One of his tips that can help us be attentive to our friendship with God is this: Ask God to go with you as you go about your day, or as you do the things you love. We may be too busy for formal prayer each day, but we can always include God in the events and happenings of our lives. We can ask God to go with us as we meet with friends, as we do the laundry, as we struggle with work issues. We can do this with confidence, because we know God wants to be included in our lives.

"If we accept God's offer and try to live as God's friends, we become partners with God in the family business of building the world."

Note: As a Jesuit parish, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special "Ignatian Year." Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?
