

MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS ON THE BEATITUDES FOR WORLD

YOUTH DAY BY ROSA LUZ POSTIGO, HISPANIC/LATINO MINISTRY COORDINATOR

The Beatitudes are, for Pope Francis, the central point of reference for the life of every Christian, called to make it a concrete program of life. For this reason, during these three years of Youth Days, he wanted young people to know them more deeply through his messages for World Youth Day and that serve us all to this day.

On the shores of the sea, Pope Francis reminds us that Jesus renewed his call to each one of us, calling us to be missionary disciples, to discover that God is the most precious treasure of our lives and to share this great joy with everyone. And for this, he proposes to us, through the Beatitudes, a path to achieve true happiness. On the mountain, a sacred place where God reveals himself, Jesus preaches as a divine teacher and teaches us the path of life, the path that he himself travels and that is himself.

Jesus invites us to follow him, Pope Francis tells us, to walk with him the path of love, which is not easy, but in which he always accompanies us and does not leave us alone.

Jesus invites us to this path of love but asks us to give him a response to his proposal of life, to decide which path we want to follow to reach true joy.

In young people there is an inexhaustible desire for happiness, the Pope tells us, that is why he invites each young person not to be afraid of going against the current, to be able to discover true happiness.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us: "man is a beggar of God" (no. 2559) and "prayer is the meeting of the thirst for God with our thirst" (no. 2560).

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."

The first beatitude that Pope Francis invites us to reflect on is the poor in spirit.

But in a time of crisis like the one we are experiencing, it is inevitable that this question: How to understand poverty as a blessing, as happiness for life?

Saint Paul in the letter to the Philippians tells us:

In Christ we see the best example. Being rich he stripped himself of his glory and became poor among the poor to enrich us with his poverty. He was born poor in a manger and poor he died on a cross.

The Pope proposes three attitudes, three ways of living:

1. Being free in relation to things, not letting ourselves be carried away by consumption; look for the essential and get rid of the superfluous. Put Jesus first, trust in God. He knows us, loves us and never forgets us.
2. Conversion in relation to the poor: worrying about them, being sensitive to their spiritual and material needs. Be supportive, overcome indifference.

Do not fill your mouth with big words towards the poor, but get closer, look them in the eye, listen to them.

"Have among yourselves the sentiments proper to Christ Jesus. Who, being of divine condition, did not avidly hold to be equal to God; on the contrary, he emptied himself taking the condition of a slave, made in the likeness of men" (Phil 2,5-7)

And today we invite you to ask yourself, what things bind you and do not let you be free? How can you approach the poor?

3. Learn from the poor. They teach us a lot; in them we discover that a person is not valuable for what he owns, his dignity is above. Be Humble and trust in God.

Pope Francis tells us that Jesus is the Kingdom of God in person. The kingdom is a gift and promise It is given to us with Jesus but must still be fully fulfilled.

The Lord wants a Church that is poor and for the poor. Evangelical poverty is necessary for the Kingdom of God to spread. In the poor, the Pope tells us, there is true, beautiful and spontaneous joy. For this reason, evangelization in our time will only be possible through the contagion of joy.

FEBRUARY 21 – APRIL 4

Through activities on 14 days, the journey will lead to a greater understanding of racial equity and racism in our nation, a greater love of all of God's children, and an increased commitment to ending racism in all forms. On this journey, travelers will be asked to examine the issues of racial equity in light of factual evidence and the teachings of Christ and the Church. We will invite the Holy Spirit to work within us to bring wisdom and love to the issues through our learning, sharing, prayer and reflection.

Program Format

March 3 - An opening Zoom meeting will include a welcome and introduction of the program's structure; plus some introductory materials.

March 6-April 9: You will receive eight emails on various days that provide videos, readings and reflection/prayer for that day. (Materials will take about an hour.) After two emails, participants will join a small discussion group via Zoom. (Schedule will be provided later).

April 13 - A closing Zoom discussion will focus on participants' reflections and ideas for continued learning and engagement.

Most materials are from the Ignatian 21-day Racial Equity Challenge. The program will be led by Leo Hanifin and Rita Zyber, parishioners at St. Mary Student Parish and Jan Carpenter, a Catholic from Brighton.

FEBRUARY 21 – APRIL 4

Join us for the JustFaith *Faith & Racial Equity: Exploring Power & Privilege* program. This nine-session program awakens individuals and groups to the economic systems, public policies, cultural norms, and hidden biases that empower some and oppress others. This material is rooted in scripture and prayer and invites participants to explore how their faith informs their response to their learning. Additionally participants are invited to discern action steps for working toward racial equity in their own communities.

Each session lasts approximately 1 ½ hours and participants commit to 1-2 hours of reading, watching videos, and reflecting between sessions. Depending on facilitator and participant preferences these sessions will meet on Zoom or in person.



LOVE AS JESUS LOVES

As we approach the celebration of love – St. Valentine’s Day, it’s good to remember that Jesus taught us pretty much everything we need to know about selfless love.

“This is my commandment: love one another as I love you.” (John 15:12)

How familiar to us are these words of Jesus? Perhaps too familiar, that they have lost their meaning. Jesus shared with his disciples the same love he received from the Father. What is clear to Jesus can at times be vague to us.

We are able to love others because we have first been loved by God. It’s one thing to know that in our heads. It’s quite another to be convinced of it in our hearts. The key is to make time in our busy lives to stop and allow God to love us, to actually feel God’s love for us personally. Loving others will flow naturally from our deep belief in God’s personal love for us.

How can I open myself more fully to God’s love today?

Is my experience of God based more on knowing or on feeling?

How might I begin to merge the two?

PRAYER:

Loving and gracious God, thank you for the love that you poured out on us in giving us your Son, Jesus. Help me to deepen my awareness of your love, and to share it with those I meet. Amen.
