SHARING INTERN SACRED STORIES BY REBECCA HAINES, 2020 MUSIC INTERN



When tasked with writing my Sacred Story a year ago, I wasn't quite sure what to say. My own faith journey had been a tumultuous road of ups and downs, of periods of both tremendous growth and pitfalls when I lost my way, and as I looked back on it all, my

failures and shortcomings seemed to stand out more than anything else. Convinced my path to holiness was so innately different from those around me, I wondered whether there was anything to be learned from my story. But in reflecting on everything that had led me to that point and talking with our campus minister, I began to gain a new perspective on it all. I discovered it was a story not just of me failing as I chased after the Lord, but of Him constantly calling me back to Himself. For the first time, I saw a constant thread of faith, of God's hand at work, throughout my entire life, even in the moments when I had thought He wasn't there. Listening to the stories of my fellow interns, I further realized that everyone's journey includes struggles, and that I wasn't as alone in these as I thought.

It's difficult to grasp how powerful these testimonies are or how much heart goes into them without hearing them for yourself. Writing and sharing a Sacred Story is nervewracking and challenging, but it is ultimately a greatly formative experience. It takes time and openness to reflect on the entire scope of your faith journey and discern what parts God is calling you to share, how to let the Lord speak through you, and how to incorporate it all into a coherent storyline that bears witness to Christ's workings in your life. Doing so requires the courage to be vulnerable and the trust that there is something worth sharing, something to be learned, in each and every story, and that God will bring it to light. I can attest that seeing how God is at work in the lives of those around us is incredibly inspiring and can help each of us to better recognize how He is working in our own lives as well.

On behalf of this year's interns, I would like to invite all of the St. Mary Student Parish community, family and friends to attend our annual Sacred Stories event on Sunday, February 20th from 6:30-7:30pm. May you all see Christ's light and works in their testimonies and discover through them part of your own Sacred Story.



FEBRUARY 21 – APRIL 4

Through activities, the journey will lead to a greater understanding of racial equity and racism in our nation, a greater love of all of God's children, and an increased commitment to ending racism in all forms.

On this journey, travelers will be asked to examine the issues of racial equity in light of factual evidence and the teachings of Christ and the Church. We will invite the Holy Spirit to work within us to bring wisdom and love to the issues though our learning, sharing, prayer and reflection.

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

THE CREATOR DEALS DIRECTLY WITH US

Early Jesuits held one "doctrine" that was fundamental for them, one that gave orientation to all their ministries and to the way they wanted to lead their own lives. It was the basic premise of the Exercises, even though it was somewhat buried: the Creator deals directly with the creature, and the creature deals directly with the Creator—heart to heart, one might say. Upon this teaching Jesuits based their more characteristic themes—indifference, discernment, and inner devotion, or consolation.

It's also a good explanation for why we may feel more connected to God when we are out in nature. Without the manmade distractions of life, God can reveal God's self to us more fully. When we truly pay attention to the beauty and work of our Creator, and that includes ourselves, we can experience God's presence and love in a deeper, more active way.

Ruth Barrows, a Carmelite nun, describes these "mystical" moments when we have a strong longing for God this way:

"For what is the mystical life but God coming to do what we cannot do; touching the depths of our being where man is reduced to his basic element?"

And Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins gives us many thoughts on praising God for nature and creation:

"Glory be to God for dappled things – for skies of couplecolour as a brinded cow; for rose-moles in all stipple upon trout that swim... Praise him." (From Pied Beauty)

Note: We are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special "Ignatian Year." Through July, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the "shattering" changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?
