INTO THE DESERT

Some thoughts for Lent from the parish's Anti-Racism Working Group

Walking in solidarity with our excluded brothers and sisters requires us to recognize the inherent dignity of all people. Thomas Merton wrote about the realization that came upon him, that we all carry that inner spark of God within us.

"... in the center of the shopping district, I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all those people, that they were mine and I theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. It was like waking from a dream of separateness, of spurious self-isolation in a special world, the world of renunciation and supposed holiness ... This sense of liberation from an illusory difference was such a relief and such a joy to me that I almost laughed out loud ... I have the immense joy of being (human), a member of a race in which God Himself became incarnate. As if the sorrows and stupidities of the human condition could overwhelm me, now I realize what we all are. And if only everybody could realize this! But it cannot be explained. There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun."

Prayer:

Christ's light shines in our world, too -- especially when we try to see and honor each other. May we always respect that light and reflect it. Lord, Jesus Christ, help us to see your light shining in the eyes of strangers and friends, sick and strong, wealthy and wounded, hungry and poor, black and white. Help us to let go of our assumptions, judgments, and agendas, and look only for God's presence. May we see each other as we really are: "Shining like the sun!" Amen.

The Transfiguration account in today's Gospel gives us a brief glimpse of Jesus in all his glory. It is offered to encourage and challenge us in our daily lives. It reminds us that our lives are far more than what we see, hear and experience every day. We must take the time to pay attention, to clear the distractions, and actually notice God's glory all around us.

"We may never experience anything as powerful as the Transfiguration. But every day in countless and seemingly small ways God does break into our world and our daily lives. Every time we experience a moment of peace, joy, reconciliation or forgiveness, God is with us. Every time that we reach out to help another person is a moment of transfiguration both for ourselves and for those we help. Each time somebody shows care and concern for us is a moment when God is reaching out to us."

This week, let us open our hearts so that we may hear Jesus speaking to us. May we slow down and look for moments of small but important times of transfiguration in our own ordinary daily lives.

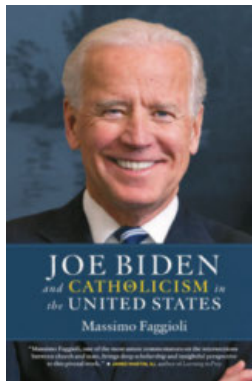
WEDDING MASS COORDINATOR NEEDED

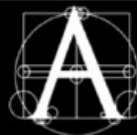
