TEMPTATION TO HATE VS CHRIST-LIKE ATTITUDE

We are all shocked and deeply saddened by the war in Ukraine. Seeing the images of useless destruction and mass killings can bring deep resentment and foster hate in souls who expect so much more from humanity.

An example of this took place in Texas to a descendent of Belarusian parents. He owns a restaurant which advertised Russian food. He and his staff have received threating letters accusing him of all sorts of things such as being a spy sent to infiltrate and help destroy the USA. He must have been a prodigious child, because he came to the States when he was four years old.

I lived through the Second World War and was subject to many newsreels about the "awful" Germans and Italians who were enemies of the USA. And yet some of my best friends were German and Italian. And their families were generous, kind, and helped us kids in many ways. Maybe that is why those newsreels, didn't really contaminate me with hate.


Speaking with Bobby Karle, sj one morning on his service trip with U of M students to El Salvador, I mentioned that we must take and accept people in their own reality and not judge them by standards of other cultures. But the differences of cultures and lands can help us to grow and try to become more open to the needs of people throughout the world and not just in our own little community.

Christ looked on the whole world not just Nazareth or Judea. He was open to the Romans (centurion), to the Samaritans (woman at the well and the Good Samaritan), to sinners (Peter, Matthew, Mary Magdalen, the adulteress, etc.), to the marginalized (lepers, possessed), even to those who belonged to groups who hated him (Nicodemus) and would betray him (Judas Iscariot, Peter).

That is how we must look on all people wherever they are from or are living, or whatever their attitudes, beliefs, or actions. Christ calls us to help him bring all people to his father. So, we must look for the positive in all people and help them in their actual and real situations. Comparisons of people, nations, or cultures is not valid if it only shows negative aspects. The idea of judgement should be far from our way of doing things. We also must separate what people do and who they actually are: the sinner from the person. And we also must avoid objectifying peoples and stop thinking in "masses" and absolute terms. Each person is a reality, a child of God, a brother or sister, whom God is calling to himself.

Jesus was flexible with rules and open to each person's situation and we must be the same.

Jesus help us to be your instrument. Allow us to be a worthy of You and to reflect you in all we do. Amen.

Dear Friends,



I am often asked of my ministry: How long is your assignment? Or, how long will you be here? This is a hard question for a Jesuit to answer, because "apostolic availability," always being ready to be missioned where one is most needed, is central to our vocation. The best that I can say, then, in answer to this question is, "I hope that I'll be here

for a while." I have said these or similar words in answer to many of you since arriving in Ann Arbor, and I have been heartened to hear many of you say in reply, "I hope that you'll be here for a while too." It's that kind of curiosity, affection and warm welcome which, among other things, make St. Mary such a special place.

It saddens me, then, because I have such a great love for this community of students, parishioners and staff, to say that I do now have an answer to that question. I will be leaving St. Mary at the end of May. Of course, new missions come with mixed feelings, and while I know that I will miss all of you, I am excited for what is coming next. Some months ago, I was contacted by the Religious Studies department at Loyola University in New Orleans, asking if I might be able to answer a need there for a full -time professor beginning in the Fall of 2022. I won't bore you with all the details, but they reached out to me specifically because I had taught there before, and they had specific needs that I was uniquely qualified to help with. I had to consider that this might be the Lord calling me to where I might be needed most at this moment. So, I prayed about it, visited with the people at Loyola, and consulted my provincial. After all that, we decided that this would be a good move and a good fit, so the provincial missioned me to New Orleans, beginning this summer. I'm excited to return to full-time teaching, and especially to the city of New Orleans, where I was ordained, and for which I have a special fondness. Even though it has been a long time since my first stint there, it is still the home of many longtime friends and former students with whom I continue to keep in touch. An additional draw was also that it places me within short driving distance from one of my closest friends, who is suffering from a serious illness.

I can't begin to enumerate all the things that I am thankful for from my time in Ann Arbor. It has been a crazy time which has challenged me in so many ways. And, always there was all of you, offering your support, generosity, comfort and friendship. While it meant that I was not able to get to know many of you as well as I would have liked, I'm not sure that there would have been a better place to ride out the Covid-19 pandemic! I knew that St. Mary was a special community from the time that I arrived, and you proved that again and again in so many ways! I had hoped my stay would be longer, but my life is so much richer for having been here.

I am so grateful to have had the opportunity to serve this community. I look forward to my remaining time with you. And, even as I prepare to go, I know that our bonds of friendship and faith will endure. You are always welcome to visit in New Orleans!

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.


Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism.
