REFLECTION ON SERVANT OF GOD SR. THEA BOWMAN

"God's Glory is revealed because we love one another across the barriers and boundaries of race, culture and class."

Servant of God, Sr. Thea Bowman, was born in Yazoo City, Mississippi in 1937 and converted to Catholicism



when she was 9 years old. She later became the only Black member of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in LaCross, WI. She brought a vibrant energy, deep faith and prophetic witness to justice and especially the Black experience in the Catholic Church. She compiled and edited the original "Lead Me, Guide Me" African- American Catholic Hymnal. She taught at all levels and was a founding faculty member of the Institute for Black Catholic Studies at Xavier University in New Orleans. She also helped to found the National Black Sisters Conference to provide support for African-American religious women.

In all that she did, Sr. Thea preached and sang of the joy of the Gospel, and shared her rich African-American culture and spirituality.. She died of metastatic breast cancer at the age of 47 but not before she brought her preaching and singing directly to the USCCB gathering of Bishops in 1989. You can find her powerful talk here:

"WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE BLACK AND CATHOLIC?"

In her speech, she told the Bishops, It means that I come to my Church fully functioning... I bring myself, my Black self, all that I am, all that I have, all that I hope to become. I bring my own history, my traditions, my experience, my culture, my African-American song and dance and gestures and movement and teaching and preaching and healing and responsibility as gift to the church."

PRAYER BY SERVANT OF GOD SR. THEA BOWMAN

Creator God, Sr. Thea told us that, "if we walk on, and talk on, and work on, and pray on, and hold on, and love on in faith, we shall overcome. Overcome weakness, overcome fatigue, overcome exhaustion, overcome pain and loneliness, overcome frustration, overcome the prejudices and the stereotypes, the anxieties, the grief, the fear, the negative attitudes - all those barriers and boundaries that keep us apart, overcome racism and classism and sexism and materialism, all those 'isms' that keep us apart." We ask you this, through your Son, the Prince of Peace, and in the Spirit of Hope, One God forever and ever. Amen.




INTO THE LIGHT




BILINGUAL STATIONS OF THE CROSS




