Pastoral Perspective

'STAY WITH ME'

It's Palm Sunday once again. A day filled with the ritual of taking home palms to remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem in triumph. We know that Easter is near – the most sacred of all our holy feast days – but first, there's some suffering ahead.

Easter is near, but Good Friday must come first.

That pretty much mirrors our current world. At this moment, people are suffering in so many ways. An entire country is facing death and destruction at the hands of a mad authoritarian. In the midst of this war, mothers are giving birth in basements; heat, medicine, and food is scarce. In our own communities, our neighbors struggle with racism, poverty, and powerful addictions that keep them from being the person God intended them to be.

The story of Jesus' passion reminds us that suffering is not new. It's such a common element of human life that our Lord took that on too, experiencing the worst kind of torture so God could truly be one of us in all ways that are human. But here's the hopeful part of these passion readings -- the end of Jesus' life shows us how to face our own suffering. Jesus stays in prayer and ultimately puts everything in God's hands.

And though Jesus was rejected by the people who started out waving palms, he was not completely alone. In these readings, we can reflect on the people along the way who helped. Simon the Cyrene, who helped him carry his cross; Veronica, who wiped his face as he passed by on that terrible walk; the women who stayed at the foot of the cross. We can pray and ask, how can I also help? How can I assist the work of Jesus?

What an amazing account of humanity we have in these readings that are coming our way this week – people in the mob, sinners, grieving disciples and people in fear and confusion.

I think of Jesus asking his friends to stay with him in the Garden while he prayed. They didn't do such a great job of giving Jesus their full presence, but our loving Jesus understood. He understands us too. We know that Jesus will always stay with us. St. Padre Pio has a wonderful prayer to remind us of our need to stay close to God.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Stay with me Lord, for you are my life, and without you, I am without fervor.

Stay with me Lord, for you are my light, and without you, I am in darkness.

Stay with me Lord, to show me your will.

Stay with me Lord, so that I hear your voice and follow you. Stay with me Lord, for I desire to love you very much, and always be in your company.

Stay with me Lord, if you wish me to be faithful to you. Stay with me Lord, for as poor as my soul is, I want it to be a place of consolation for you, a nest of Love.


