Like the disciples on the way to Emmaus, I find Jesus drawing near to me. Hearing first confessions the other day was consoling, and Jesus was certainly present in the goodness of the children preparing for their first communion, and in the dedication of their catechists. As we wind down confirmation

classes, I see the presence of Jesus in the desires of these teenagers to be disciples in our world today. It is so well modeled in their catechists who pass on the faith.

Also, it was so fun seeing our students dancing the night away at our semi-formal dance. Their joy and happiness remind me that God is indeed alive and with us. I always look forward to graduation and the celebration of sacrifices made over the years, and the new life coming with a college degree from the University of Michigan. Finally, I was so moved by the care and love of all of you as I went off for surgery and gradually recovered, clear signs of God's love in action through all of you. Although most of our experience of Church is right here at St. Mary Student Parish, we belong to a worldwide Church and to our local Diocese of Lansing. As disciples, we are all called to support the mission of the Church and all her good works to help others come to know the love of Christ. This diocesan appeal supports so many good works. The fund helps care for retired priests, educates seminarians, feeds and shelters the poor through Catholic Charities, ministers to our growing Latino community,

fosters our Catholic hospitals, aids our catholic schools, and so much more. We actually receive funds from this appeal each year for our Campus Ministry Program and our Hispanic Ministry Program. **DSA** is an opportunity for all of us to put God's word into action, to participate personally as Christ's disciples in communion with Catholics throughout our Diocese. Our goal this year is \$102,327 dollars.

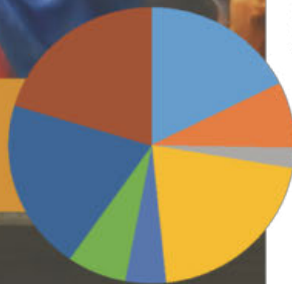

## REFUGEE CO-SPONSORSHIP UPDATE

### THE GOOD NEWS:

We surpassed our fundraising goal and have plenty of money to begin the co-sponsorship process. Thank you for your generosity! We have many volunteers - students and resident parishioners - who completed the volunteer screening and are assigned to the various teams (housing, healthcare, education, transportation, employment, finance, etc.). We submitted all our application materials to Jewish Family Services (JFS) on March 10.

### THE FRUSTRATING NEWS:

We are still waiting to be matched. I've been in touch with JFS each week. Here are some of the responses I've recently received:

- ✚ April 15 from JFS: "I don't have any updates. There still hasn't been any new travel since we last spoke. St. Mary's parish is at the top of my list for a match. I've heard that we're expecting more Afghan clients in the spring and there's some talk that we'll possibly get Ukrainian cases."
- ✚ April 19 from JFS: "I touched base with our national affiliate and there are many other agencies experiencing low travel rates. She's going to touch base with a few folks on her end and see if she can come up with an update. I'll keep you in the loop!!"

### HOUSING REQUESTS:

We are still looking for an affordable 2 bedroom apartment for a refugee family in the Ann Arbor area. Nearby access to public transportation is needed. ## IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

### 'THE ONE WHO LIVES'

After rising from the tomb, Jesus wastes no time in appearing to those who loved him. He consoles them, and wishes them peace. His glorious presence reminds them of God's power to conquer despair, tyranny, and even death.

St. Ignatius asked his students and Jesuit priests to meditate about Jesus going to visit his Mother, Mary, right after he rises from the dead. In this form of imaginative prayer, we are asked to picture what they might say and do as they celebrate together. It's a prayer that can lead to wonderful insight and an experience of closeness to Jesus and Mary.

But every day, we have the chance to see Jesus – completely present to us in the midst of our everyday world. Jesus is present

through others, through the work of Holy Spirit, in the Word, in our Sacraments, and even in our blessings and challenges. Our job is to be open, and to pay attention.

In our second reading today, the writer named John tells about his encounter with Christ during his imprisonment on the Island of Patmos.

*When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever. (Rev. 1: 18-19)*

May all our encounters with the Risen Christ bring us new life and new joy. Happy Easter!

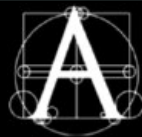

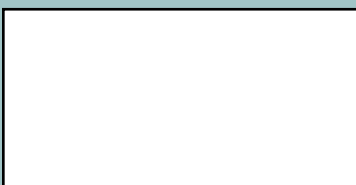
