Pastoral Perspective

HAPPY FEAST DAY, ST. IGNATIUS! BY RITA ZYBER, RCIA & SCC COORDINATOR



Last Spring, I began coordinating a weekly column for the parish bulletin, "In the Spirit of Ignatius." I wanted to share with people the basic thoughts of this important saint who has changed the way I pray and approach my faith.

It was a bit of work, but it helped me too

(locating new resources, discovering new prayers and authors). There is a wealth of information about the teachings of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits. And for good reason.

Sometimes called "a worldly saint," Ignatius discovered and shared detailed methods for prayer that still apply to our lives in practical ways some 500 years later. Mostly, he would encourage us not to keep our faith in a separate compartment (like just in church). Instead, we should go out into the world and find God in all things.

This month we close out the "Ignatian Year" on July 31, which is also the Feast Day of St. Ignatius. This special year marked the 500th anniversary of Ignatius being wounded in battle by a cannonball, and turning his life toward God during his recovery.

Since we are a parish led by Jesuit priests, we honored Ignatius this past year with events, resources and these regular bulletin summaries to help people pray and think a little closer to the "Ignatian way."

I am always amazed at how this important saint seemed to completely grasp the concepts of psychology long before it was ever studied. He urged us to pay attention to our thoughts and feelings (interior movements). It is in these places (and pretty much everywhere) that God speaks to us. For me, one of the most helpful questions to ask each day is, "where did I see God in that?" I am also grateful that he laid out such detailed suggestions and exercises, and that the Jesuits willingly share them to help all of us "choose what better leads to God's deepening his life in me" (from his First Principle and Foundation).

As this milestone year comes to a close this we share one more thought from the Ignatian Spirituality team at Marquette University in Milwaukee.

Be transformed.

Sometimes life fires an event at us that hits us like a cannonball. We feel hopeless. Like the legs beneath us have been shattered — and nothing is left to hold us up.

What if, in these desolate times, we called to the light instead of staying in darkness? What if we understood it as our opportunity for a new direction? As our call to take personal responsibility and make things better?

A lost job becomes a revitalized career. A failed dream results in newfound strength and resilience. The sorrow of tragedy is channeled into positive action. A global pandemic creates a world where simple human connection has profound meaning.

When cannonballs hit, we can lean on the grace of God. We can embrace God's invitation to let ourselves be guided. We can be reborn in the aftermath, find purpose in what comes next and harness our cannonballs into a force for good.

None of us can change what happens to us. But we can choose to let our cannonball moments change us for the better. We can let them transform us, and through us, our world — and everyone in it — can be transformed.




