DISPARITIES THAT TUG AT MY HEART

"Near the private jets that shuttle billionaires to their opulent Sun Valley getaways, Ana Ramon Bartolome and her family have spent this summer living in the only place available to them: behind a blue tarp in a sweltering two-car garage." This was the first sentence from the

August 1 New York Times cover story. The article describes the increased challenge for workers, including a high school principal, to find affordable housing in the "famous ski-andgolf playground" of Sun Valley, Idaho. Sun Valley is not unique. Rather, it represents the increasing income disparity, housing shortage, and lack of access to basic rights that plagues the majority of our world's population.

During the first two weeks of July I had the privilege to visit Belize and Mexico, two places I lived in my early 20s and that were very influential to me becoming a Jesuit. I had dreamed of returning as a priest since entering the Jesuits twelve years ago. With five days left I broke my foot, canceled my remaining visits, and was treated by a generous benefactor to a few nights at an all-inclusive beach resort. Although I've attempted to avoid these English -speaking tourist traps in the past, I was grateful to be pampered for my final days in Mexico as I hobbled around on crutches. Due to my injury and ability to speak Spanish, I had many conversations with the staff at the hotel, especially the lifeguards who checked on me each day and applied anti-inflation gel to my puffy, bruised foot. As I developed rapport with one of the life guards named Juan Carlos, he shared with me that he and other hotel workers earn between \$200-\$300 per month, depending on their position. I thought of another hotel worker I ran into earlier in the day promoting a special full-moon dinner party at the hotel for the price of \$85 per person. That is roughly ¹/₃ of the monthly earnings of an average hotel employee. (Not sure why you'd pay \$85 per person for dinner when you're at an all-inclusive resort, but that's besides the point!) I asked Juan Carlos if the hotel provides English classes for employees or support to get a work visa to work at one of

their locations in the United States. Perplexed by my question, he shook his head no.

Over the past few days, our SMSP Refugee Sponsorship team has been seeking short-term housing for the Enamorado family so they don't have to spend nearly two months in a hotel while they wait to move into a long-term apartment at the end of August. We've searched Airbnb, VRBO, Craigslist, Sabbatical Homes and are unable to find a twobedroom residence for the month of August for under \$8,000. It's been shocking to us that we cannot find a better option than an extended stay hotel 30 minutes away that costs about \$5,500 for the month. It really tugs at my heart to think that so many people I know have multiple homes, including my own family, and we can't even find a small apartment this month for this beautiful family that has lived through so much.

In the Gospel on August 1st Jesus tells the disciples, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." They said to him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." He said, "Bring them here to me." Jesus said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied. Twelve wicker baskets remained. (Matthew 14: 16-20)

In the Gospel on Sunday, August 7 Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms." (Luke 12:33-32)

FOR REFLECTION:

Why do some of us have so much while so many more struggle to access even the basic necessities of life? How can we individually and communally - respond to Jesus' instruction to, "give them some yourselves" and to "sell your belongings and give alms"? Perhaps the first step is awareness and gratitude for the gifts and resources we have.

Let us seek to dismantle systems that divide and look for ways to share what we have.




