Pastoral Perspective

A DESIRE TO SERVE

We recently had our annual staff retreat which is always a highlight for me. They are not only inspiring and motivating, but they are a time for us as a staff to reflect on the past year and to also look at our hopes and aspirations for the coming year. We are often so busy with day to day tasks and activities that we don't otherwise take the time for this much-needed reflection. This year's retreat theme was "A Desire to Serve" and was led by Fr. Richard Baumann, SJ.

Fr. Richard reminded us that as Christians, we are called to glorify Christ and serve others. "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Mt. 25:40). In order to serve, he suggested that we first need to identify, pray about, and reflect on our holy desires. Why "holy" desires? Because holy desires are good longings or stirrings and are indicators that God is at work in us. The grace of the Holy Spirit is urging us to make progress and move us towards our goal of glorifying God. The more we focus on positive, holy desires, the less we will be drawn to wayward, disordered, and unloving desires. St. Ignatius experienced this while recuperating from his military injuries. His autobiography tells us that prior to being injured, he was quite vain and determined to make a "great name" for himself. (The Autobiography of St. Ignatius, pg. 20) As he recovered, though, he spent much of his time reading about Christ and the Saints and 'by frequent reading of these books he began to get some love for spiritual things'. (pg. 24) 'The vain thoughts were gradually lessened by means of these desires.' (pg. 28) St. Paul reminds us to continue to persevere as we strive for holy desires, even when doubt, tiredness, weakness and trials creep in. Be patient and don't get discouraged "... one thing I do, forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on..." (Phil 3:13).

Once we have identified our holy desires, we are called to be on mission, to make a positive contribution, and to serve. Serving and helping others is a perfect way to glorify God. Jesus "...came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life..." (Mt 20:28). Service is exemplified in endless ways and places and it can be something as simple as lending

a listening ear, giving of your time, giving of your talent, and/or giving of your treasure. Serving others is possible within our families, workplaces, schools, communities, and churches. St. Mary Student Parish offers many ways to serve. Please consider any of the many available opportunities to serve: lector, usher, greeter, catechist, music ministry, eucharistic minister, etc. You will not only be helping others but you will be glorifying our Lord!

"For Ignatius, doing good, being of service to others, helping wherever we can, being committed to justice—all this gives glory to God. His is a spirituality of active involvement in our world. We are encouraged to be 'people for others.' It is easy to see why the words 'glory' and 'service' are almost synonyms for Ignatius. The greater service is the greater glory....God is glorified in any service we give to the Church and to other people." (God Ever Greater, p. 145, Brian O'Leary).

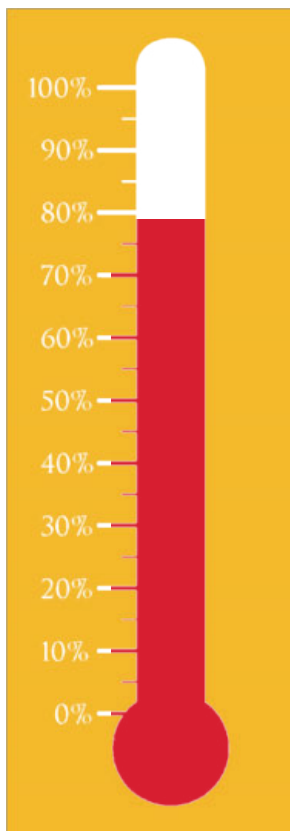

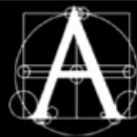
