CATECHIST REFLECTION

Please find below, some wonderful reflections from a few of our amazing and faith-filled St. Mary Student Parish catechists. All of our catechists give so generously of their time and talent and when one gives from the heart, one receives in ways never imagined.

"Hi! My name is Sophie and I am a sophomore studying nursing. I have been a catechist at St. Mary Student Parish for two years. Last year I taught 7th grade, and this year I teach with the Teen Confirmation program. My experience as a catechist has positively impacted me and grown my faith because teaching forces me to reexamine the reasons behind my beliefs. My favorite part of being a catechist is spending time with and learning from students. They will often ask questions or make comments about topics I haven't considered before. We both learn from each other! "

"Hello! My name is Ryan Armbrustmacher. I am a practicing civil engineer and I have been a catechist with the Family Faith Formation at St. Mary for 4 years teaching both kindergarten and 2nd grade. I love being able to share God's love with younger children and providing a fun, creative space to learn more about our Catholic faith. Every week is an adventure with the little kids and I love hearing the questions and prayer intentions they share with the group. Being a Catechist has challenged my creativity side and begun to prepare me to be a parent myself one day and I am very grateful for the experience!"

"Hello, my name is Athera Yakoo, and I am a junior studying biomolecular science. This is my first year as a 5th-grade catechist. I have loved volunteering to help kids grow closer to God. The fabulous 5th graders are very curious about how to grow in their faith and what that looks like in today's world. During our first catechism session, they asked meticulous questions about vocations, how God created the world, and who gets to enter Heaven. I am impressed by their deep-

thinking skills, and their ability to absorb information. They have truly inspired me to continue asking questions about who God truly is, and I look forward to growing in our community of faith, hope, and love. "

"My name is Luke Bugada, and I am a chemical engineering PhD student at UM. This is my fifth year as a catechist for Teen Confirmation, and it has been a great experience. As a catechist, I try to help the students grow in their faith to prepare them for confirmation, but I have found that I am also impacted by this experience. I've learned a lot about how to live my faith by listening to and following the examples of the other catechists and Fr. Jim, who helps with Teen Confirmation. However, I have been impacted the most through my interactions with the students. Spending time with the students is always a lot of fun, and I learn a great deal by listening to what they believe and answering their questions. In fact, my favorite part of being a catechist is when a student asks a question and another student answers it - often doing a better job answering the question than I would! I also really enjoy getting to know the students and seeing how they grow from when I meet them in September to when they are confirmed in April. This is an important step for them, and I feel very privileged to be able to play a small part in their preparation."

PRO-LIFE STATEMENT

FROM STUDENTS FOR LIFE AT SAINT MARYS STUDENT PARISH

Reproductive Freedom For All is a pleasantly-worded offer, but those words disguise drastic policy change: abortions up to the moment of birth, an egregious violation of human dignity that is (rightly) unpopular with the vast majority of Michiganders. The deceptive and counter-majoritarian nature of Proposal 3 is alone enough grounds to reject it.

We unequivocally oppose Proposal 3 because it does not treat life as dignified and sacred, just as we oppose any policy that treats human beings as disposable. As Catholics, we believe that all life is a sacred gift from God. It is never ours for the taking. All of us are called to protect the vulnerable who are under attack: the poor, the refugee, the elderly, and in this case, the unborn.

Proposal 3 is particularly egregious for two reasons: first, because of the massive scale on which it would allow the right life to be attacked, and second, because it hides its nefarious changes underneath the appearance of something that we all support: the dignity of women and mothers.

Join us to celebrate the Day of Dead on **Sunday October 30 after 2 pm mass.** We will share family heritage and traditions! We will have some sweet treats ("Pan de los Muertos"). All are welcome!

The Day of the Dead (el Día de los Muertos), is originally a Mexican holiday where families welcome back the souls of their deceased relatives for a brief reunion that includes food, drink and celebration. A blend of Mesoamerican ritual, European religion and Spanish culture, the holiday is celebrated each year from October 31-November 2. While November 1 is All Saints Day, November 2 is All Souls Day or the Day of the Dead.

It is during these celebrations that we honor and remember those we have loved and lost. We recall how they have touched our lives and left this world with the hope and promise of eternal life. This is a great opportunity for our parish to remember our loved ones in community.

We invite you to submit the names of your deceased loved ones online, or write them on the cards in baskets at the altar. You may also bring a photograph or item to place on the Altar through most of November. During this time, the names will be posted on the altar or on the bulletin board in the atrium. St. Mary Student Parish will pray along with you and the Communion of Saints for your loved ones.
