DAY OF THE DEAD CELEBRATION

I am from the city of Toluca which is near the capital of Mexico. Every November the magic and festivity of the Day of the Dead comes forth with the traditional Alfeñique Fair. The word “alfeñique,” of Arabic origin, refers to a cooked and stretched sugar paste. Today the frosted sugar figures that are made for the Day of the Dead are designated by that name. In Mexico, alfeñique is a phenomenon in which Indigenous customs and techniques merge.

The traditional Alfeñique Fair is famous for the sale and exhibition of sweet alfeñiques where you can find all kinds of sugar objects but the main and most characteristic is the sugar skull (la calaverita) decorated in bright colors and of all sizes. The Alfeñique Fair is a time to celebrate traditional customs and reflect on the rich national and cultural identity of the region, often being the preferred destination of entire families who get together to enjoy and share customs. Like in my case, where I remember my grandmother telling us how she enjoyed taking my mom for a walk around the square on those days.

Then my mom would take me to enjoy the colorful and fascinating exhibits, and though I can no longer continue with that tradition because of the distance, I keep talking to my daughter about how I lived my Day of the Dead season in my hometown. What is more, I can smell the sweet aroma of sugar that peeked through the corridors of the Portales, and I do not lose the hope of being able to take her one day.

The celebration of the Day of the Dead is quite different for each family in Mexico. Since there is nothing established, each family and each city has its own tradition, but its meaning goes beyond walking through the fair, painting their faces like Catrinas, making an offering, or staying in vigil in the pantheon. It is about meeting for a moment with those who one day took us in their arms and told us I love you, with those who gave us their time, their example, and their life, it is about honoring their memory.

Now we live in Michigan and the distance makes us yearn more, for the past. Although we do not have a fair nearby, we decided to bring a part of this tradition with us. And not only for us, but for the entire community that, just like us, feels that connection with its roots. Which is why for more than seven consecutive years, the Day of the Dead offering has been mounted in this beloved Parish. It is different every year because, as I mentioned above, it is about each generation leaving its mark.

Life is fragile and death reaches us all eventually, but death is only the beginning of a new life, and families continue to gather to remember those beings who have gone before us.

Celebrating All Saints, All Souls, and Day of the Dead

Join us to celebrate the Day of Dead on **Sunday October 30 after 2 pm mass**. We will share family heritage and traditions! We will have some sweet treats (“Pan de los Muertos”). All are welcome!

The Day of the Dead (el Día de los Muertos), is originally a Mexican holiday where families welcome back the souls of their deceased relatives for a brief reunion that includes food, drink and celebration. A blend of Mesoamerican ritual, European religion and Spanish culture, the holiday is celebrated each year from October 31-November 2. While November 1 is All Saints Day, November 2 is All Souls Day or the Day of the Dead.

It is during these celebrations that we honor and remember those we have loved and lost. We recall how they have touched our lives and left this world with the hope and promise of eternal life. This is a great opportunity for our parish to remember our loved ones in community.

We invite you to submit the names of your deceased loved ones online, or write them on the cards in baskets at the altar. You may also bring a photograph or item to place on the Altar through most of November. During this time, the names will be posted on the altar or on the bulletin board in the atrium. St. Mary Student Parish will pray along with you and the Communion of Saints for your loved ones.

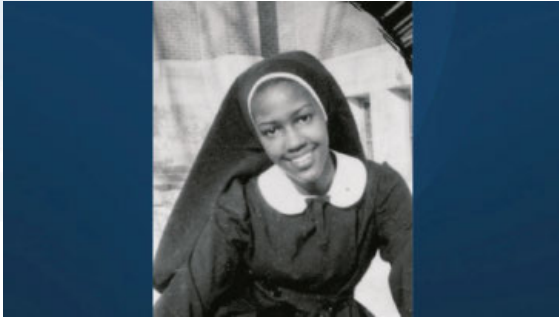

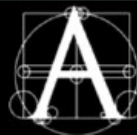
