## Parish Insight



### CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING AND THE ECONOMY OF FRANCESCO :

#### A CONVERSATION WITH FR. BOBBY AND ELIZABETH GARLOW

Elizabeth Garlow spoke at the October 27 Ig.Nite event about CST and her work with the Economy of Francesco. The next day, I sat down with Elizabeth to learn more about her recent experience at the Economy of Francesco Global Summit in Assisi, Italy. Below is an excerpt from our conversation.

#### What is the Economy of Francesco (EoF)?

The EoF began when Pope Francis wrote a letter to young people in 2019 inviting them to build a moral economy. He acknowledged that young people - students, entrepreneurs, and community leaders - were all active protagonists in building the economy. He invited us to meet with him in Assisi, the home of St. Francis and St. Clare who were themselves early protagonists of a new economy (choosing voluntary poverty over excessive wealth, walking with and accompanying the poor). One thousand young people gathered to explore questions like: How do we build an economy of care? How do we transform finance to be at the service of people rather than the other way around? How might we practice agriculture in ways that regenerate the land?

#### What surprised and inspired you about the Global Summit?

The creativity of young people and their work in local contexts. We met young people from Cuba who are working through their Diocese to build entrepreneurship incubators in a country that is currently struggling with access to basic goods. We met many people throughout Africa who are thinking about locally designed and locally led economies that center renewable energy and climate mitigation strategies. Many are looking for access to capital and resources that honor the vision they have for their communities. They are truly endeavoring to do what Pope Francis has invited us to do : create opportunities for good work for all.

#### How does this apply in the US context?

Trying to combat a culture of individualism that is so prevalent here. Part of it is learning to ask for, offer, and receive support from one another. We're so used to exchanging through the lens of money - I sell something and you buy it. What are alternative ways we can offer support to one another and to practice an

economy of care, repair and gift? For example, in my neighborhood we have a childcare co-op that uses time banking. It is also important to question our cultural narrative that the good life is about consuming stuff. How might we practice simplicity and resist a culture of unfettered accumulation?

#### What is unique about Pope Francis' vision and style of leadership?

Pope Francis recognizes that the institutions of the future have to be in relationship with and led by people on the peripheries. His invitation to dream about the future emphasizes authentic listening and inclusive participation in imagining and building new solutions to our global challenges.

He is inviting us to encounter those on the margins. Encounters with the poor transform us, and our own internal conversion is born of these encounters.

He also connects revolutionary thought with action and experimentation. He's not afraid to invite people to try. His message for us in Assisi was to use our heads, hearts, and hands.

#### How does Jesus relate to all this?

Jesus journeyed with both the poor and also with the tax collectors. Everyone has a seat at the table and we are in it together. For me, it all comes back to how we create opportunities for encounter across lines of division and - like Zaccheus - come down from our trees of "business as usual" and welcome Jesus' radically inclusive love into our lives.

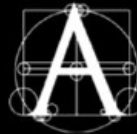
