



UNSETTLING HISTORIES: U-M MUSEUM TOUR

Legacies Tour at UMMA

Join docents Connie Powers (a parish member) and Mary Wakefield, for a special tour at the University of Michigan Museum of Art on **Saturday, October 15 at 1 p.m**.

The tour looks at pieces in the museum's collection with an eye toward racial justice, and the museum's review of how works and people's histories have been prioritized in the past. The tours were given last year and Connie reflected on their impact:

"Art has a way of opening our eyes and our hearts. During the SMSP tours, some eyes saw a torn canvas, a physically exposed woman on bent knees, a twisted birdcage, and a bruised American flag. Some hearts felt destruction and violence, hope and reconciliation, privilege, remorse, mercy and forgiveness. All came away changed."


