Pastoral Perspective



Dear Friends,

Last Sunday the Church celebrated the 108th Day for Migrants and Refugees. Since 1914 the number of forcibly displaced people has increased exponentially, reaching over 100 million for the first time in recorded history this past year. "As of May 2022, <u>100 million individuals were forcibly displaced</u> worldwide, that is, 1 in every 80 people on earth. This accounts for an increase of 10.7 million people displaced from the end of the previous year." (UN Refugee Agency) In light of these numbers, our sponsorship of one refugee family may feel like a mere drop in the ocean. And yet, thanks be to God, this one family is safe, thriving in their new life, and enriching our community. We now can see the refugee and migration crisis not just as a number or a news headline, but also as part of us. For we have all been "strangers in a foreign land" (Exodus 2:22).

On Monday two of our student interns, David and Libby, and I spent time at Mercy House, a Dorothy Day-inspired Catholic Worker house in Ann Arbor. We met a young woman named Danielle who is almost nine months pregnant and, until last week, was sleeping outdoors. Mercy House is currently providing shelter for Danielle and seeking ways to ensure she has housing until she can get into a shelter (a 2-3 month wait). The students and I spoke with Danielle about organizing a baby shower in the coming weeks, an idea she was delighted by. Reflecting on our experience at Mercy House, David and Libby shared, "it was amazing how joyful and welcoming everyone was. One man shared his passion for cooking and his hopes to start a cooking business. I often see people asking for money on the street, but now I have come to know them personally." When we encounter and dialogue with people who were previously strangers or different from us, they soon become our friends in Christ, the face of God in our midst.

So often God often chooses the displaced and stranger as messengers of his truth. Migrants, refugees, and the homeless are often sent as bearers of truth and to unsettle the settled. Do we allow the marginalized and the struggles of the world to unsettle us?

Pope Francis wrote in his letter on the 2022 World Day of Migrants and Refugees, "If we want to cooperate with our heavenly Father in building the future, let us do so together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom."

I am grateful to be part of a community deeply committed to faith, service, and justice. Thank you for your support and generosity.
